Welcome To Greenwood Village Parks, Trails And Open Space

Greenwood Village's parks, trails and open space are a large part of what makes Greenwood Village such a special place to live and visit. Encompassing more than 156 acres of developed parks and 276 acres of open space, these areas are unique in landscape including a mix of urban and rural lands that provide limitless opportunities to free the mind and spirit year-round! Trails throughout the Village also provide recreational opportunities, preserving community and neighborhood character, protecting natural habitat, allowing for improved water and air quality. Approximately 5.47 miles of premier regional trail, the High Line Canal, winds through the Village.

Trails in Greenwood Village have been a vital part of the quality of life in Greenwood Village. Trails provide recreational opportunities, preserve community and neighborhood character, protect natural habitat, and allow for improved water and air quality. TRAIL ETIQUETTE

- Village trails are for walking, hiking/jogging, biking, and horseback riding. Remember to yield right-of-way to pedestrians and horses if riding a bike.
- Trail users are the eyes and ears of the trail system. Report problems, e.g., fallen trees, holes (prairie dog holes or holes in asphalt), or broken fences to the Greenwood Village Maintenance Facility at 303-708-6100.
- The maximum trail speed is 15 mph. Motorized vehicles are not allowed on Village trails.
- When hiking/jogging with a dog, follow posted leash regulations. Keep a short leash on your dog when passing (or being passed by) horses, cyclists, or other pedestrians. Please pick up after your pet and discard in trash receptacles. Dog bag stations are located throughout the trail system and are supplied with bags for your use.
- If you choose to wear a stereo/headphone set, make sure that the volume neither prevents you from hearing what is happening around you nor disturbs other trail users.
- Animals on the trails may act unexpectedly. If you are unsure about approaching someone with a horse or dog, ask the handler for guidance.
- Respect the trails. Littering, dumping, and misuse of any public property is not allowed. No glass bottles are allowed on Village trails.

ETIQUETTE FOR EQUESTRIANS

- Make sure your horse has a good temperament, proper training and manners for riding on public trails.
- Stay on equestrian approved trails. Horses are permitted on all asphalt trails; however, dirt trails are preferred for the safety of the horse and rider.
- Please follow all posted signs and use common sense in crowded areas, e.g., slow down when you pass others on the trails and never gallop past another trail user.
- Be courteous to other users of public trail heads/parking areas and do not clean out your trailer at these locations.

TIPS FOR SAFE CYCLING IN AND AROUND GREENWOOD VILLAGE

- Yield to horses and pedestrians and give an audible signal when passing.
- Be mindful of horses and pedestrians, use extra caution around them.
- Follow all traffic signs and signals; they apply to all vehicles, including bicycles.
- For your protection, **always** wear a helmet and do not wear headphones while riding your bike.
- Make yourself visible. Equip your bike and yourself with proper reflectors and lights.

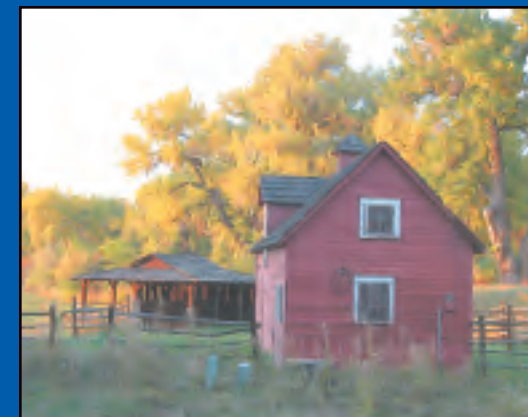
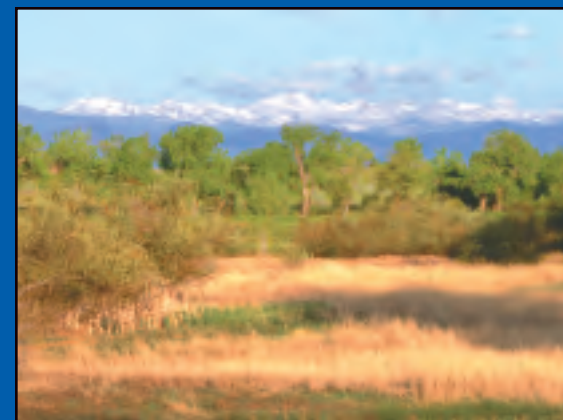
