

# MAYOR'S REPORT



The end of a year, and beginning of a new year, is always a time for both reflection and anticipation. It's hard for me to believe that my first term as Mayor is over – it felt like it flew by! I am grateful for the opportunity to serve a second term and continue the work of the community over the next two years.

Overall, 2024 was a successful year for Cherry Hills Village. Beyond the daily work that we may tend to take for granted, like maintaining the roads, approving building permits, and taking care of our parks, the City had several large initiatives this past year:

**Public Safety** – The safety of our community is consistently a top priority. Last year the City Council authorized the expansion of our police department with three additional police officers and a K9 officer. Our police department is the only department in the metro area to be fully staffed to authorized strength. The increased installation and use of license plate reading cameras (Flock cameras) has helped our police department deter crime in our community. The police department also implemented a new Citizens Police Academy where residents gain a deeper understanding of police operations. The first class of participants rated it a HUGE success!

**Quincy Farm** – The past year saw the opening of the west side of the farm to the public with the addition of a nature trail to allow peaceful enjoyment of the area. Since the east side was opened to the public in 2023, both sides of this beautiful historic property are now open to the public daily from sunrise to sunset. The Cherry Hills Land Preserve, the City's partner in this endeavor, conducted 23 programs at the farm focused on nature, conservation, history, and community outreach. Quincy Farm was also the subject of several ballot issues in November. We are delighted that the citizens of Cherry Hills Village voted to preserve public access to the property.

**Cell Phone Coverage** – The City Council continued to work on improving cell phone coverage within the Village over the past year. In 2023 we hired a consultant, researched the challenges and potential solutions, and gathered significant public input through surveys and meetings. In 2024 one potential solution was identified for further community input which has proven to be extremely controversial. Work will continue on this issue in 2025.

**Electrification** – In 2024 the City installed electric vehicle charging stations at City Hall, acquired two electric vehicles as city vehicles, and replaced some small maintenance equipment with electric alternatives.

**Election** – In November we elected three new Council members and the Mayor. Thank you for supporting my service as Mayor for another two years. I would like to welcome Doug Robinson, David Heller, and Karen Fisher to the City Council. All three of these individuals bring exceptional experience and knowledge to the job and will be part of a very productive team.

**Finances** – We closed 2024 with a significant annual operating surplus this year due primarily to increased property and sales tax revenues. Our conservative budgeting and prudent management of funds left us with a General Fund operating surplus of approximately \$5.7M.

Looking forward to 2025, we will continue working on many of the items above in addition to priorities outlined in our Master Plan. Specifically, City Council and staff plan to address the following:

**Public Safety** – Our police department is always involved in continuous improvement. A few things residents might notice in 2025 are the addition of a second K9 officer and the creation of a reserve officer program which would further augment our already exceptional staffing levels. The second Citizens Police Academy will also take place. If you are interested sign up soon! Spots are expected to fill quickly.

**Quincy Farm** – Quincy Farm will see some big improvements in 2025 with the goal of making it a gathering space for our community. The City will complete several big projects already underway including the renovation of the historic Big Barn, dredging and rehabilitating the pond, and

reconstructing the bridge across the High Line Canal. New projects for 2025 include a feasibility study for renovations to the farm house on the east side of the property, a landscaping plan for the east side, and new signage for the property. The Cherry Hills Land Preserve will continue to offer an array of programs throughout the year. If you would like to be part of the exciting things happening at the farm please reach out to the Cherry Hills Land Preserve through [www.quincyfarm.org](http://www.quincyfarm.org) to participate, volunteer and/or donate. If you haven't yet visited Quincy Farm I encourage you to check it out! It is located on the south side of Quincy at the High Line Canal crossing.

**Cell Phone Coverage** – I mentioned that we completed a thorough study in 2023/2024 and that one feasible solution has emerged from that process. Input from the community so far shows that residents agree that cell coverage is a problem, but that there is little agreement about the solution. The results of the study and associated recommendations will be presented to the new City Council in January to determine what next steps should be taken. Rest assured that this is not the end, but the beginning of a process that will involve significant community input before any decisions are made. Please be engaged in this process. This is an important city-wide issue and we need input from residents throughout the Village.

**High Line Canal** – Denver Water has transferred ownership of the High Line Canal to the various counties along the route with the intent to convert it into a green stormwater management system. The City has already completed a study of the work required along our stretch of the canal. Final design is planned for 2025 starting with spillway construction at Blackmer Common. The City will also resurface the trail with a new layer of crusher fines.

**Finances** – As always, the City has developed a balanced budget for 2025 which includes the initiatives described above. Our budget leaves us with healthy reserves and well positioned to continue to meet the needs of the community for the long-term. ## **CHERRY HILLS VILLAGE RECREATION REIMBURSEMENT RULES**

Residents of Cherry Hills Village (primary residence only) who participate in a recreation program, activity, class or event offered by a municipal or special district recreation department, a non-profit youth sports organization or any municipal golf course located within the seven-county Denver metropolitan area (Adams, Arapahoe, Boulder, Broomfield, Denver, Douglas, Jefferson) may be eligible for a partial reimbursement of certain costs from the City of Cherry Hills Village. For purposes of this program, “youth sports organization” shall mean a sports organization whose primary purpose is to provide recreational activities for primary or secondary school students.

### **REIMBURSEMENT PROVISIONS**

Each primary household in Cherry Hills Village is eligible for a maximum \$500.00 annual reimbursement when participating in an activity that qualifies for reimbursement. The amount of reimbursement shall be 50 percent of the cost incurred by the resident; however, reimbursement costs shall not exceed a maximum of \$50.00 per single activity, per resident, to include memberships and passes. The amount of reimbursement for an annual membership or pass shall be 50 percent of the cost incurred by the resident; however, reimbursement costs shall not exceed a maximum of \$500.00 annually per household. An annual membership is intended to designate a year-long membership and includes such facilities as Greenwood Athletic and Tennis Club and municipal recreation centers such as South Suburban. Seasonal sporting activities such as soccer, baseball, lacrosse, swimming, hockey, gymnastics, etc., are considered single activities.

### **REIMBURSEMENT PROCEDURE**

1. Obtain an itemized receipt that includes the participant’s name, address, name of agency, name of activity, activity fee(s) and activity date(s). Receipts must be submitted in the year the fee was paid, not the year the activity takes place.  
**Note:** The following will not be accepted as receipts: bank statements, cancelled checks, non-itemized credit card receipts, handwritten receipts and registration forms. Initiation fees, rentals, tax charged, national dues, merchandise, childcare, travel, uniforms and golf carts do not qualify for reimbursement.
2. Complete the Recreation Reimbursement Form, attach all itemized receipts and email, mail or deliver this information to the Village Center by **4:30pm on the second Friday in January** for the previous year’s reimbursements. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**
3. To conserve City staff time and resources, and to help us easily track each household’s reimbursement we are asking our residents to submit all their receipts for the program year on no more than 2 reimbursement submittals in a program year.

**It is the resident’s responsibility to ensure that their recreation reimbursement application is complete and has been received by the City by 4:30 PM on the second Friday in January.**

All the information above will be required, and residency will be verified. It is the obligation of the City staff to ensure against abuse of this program and final authority will rest with the City Manager to suspend or eliminate reimbursement requests determined to be in violation of the terms of this program.

## Public Works

The mission of the Cherry Hills Village Public Works Department is to provide high quality streets, infrastructure, parks, and open space for all residents. The Department strives to be stewards of the environment and be fiscally responsible in all aspects of its operations. The Cherry Hills Village Department of Public Works is comprised of 2 main divisions (Parks and Streets) with 18 full-time employees who possess special skills and knowledge acquired through education, training, and experience to meet the public's needs. The Department also employs 6 seasonal employees in the summer. Some of the many responsibilities of the Department include:

- Maintain 50 miles of streets (100 lane miles)
- Maintain 26 miles of bridle trails, 55 acres of open space and park land
- Stormwater management
- Operate 6.8 miles of sanitary sewer lines
- Oversee all City facility maintenance and repairs
- Plan and manage recreation special events
- Administer the Recreation Reimbursement Program
- Manage the household hazardous waste program and Spring Clean-Up
- Right-of-way construction permitting
- Capital construction management
- Snow removal
