

## NEIGHBORHOOD TALENT: ELAINE ASARCH

**C**herry Hills Village is filled with neighbors who wear many hats and have numerous talents. Many of us know about Asarch Dermatology and/or the Asarch Spa, but are you aware that Elaine Asarch is an abstract oil painter? Elaine's art career began in interior design, moved on to plein air landscapes, from there to figure painting and finally has landed into the arena of abstract art. It is quite fascinating to hear her describe her work. "Color and motion become the visual language which expresses that which cannot be quantified or defined....Art makes us look at ourselves and at the world in a universal way and reveals our own truths. At the highest level I believe art and life to be the same. The arts bind us together as humanity."

Elaine was born in Des Moines, Iowa and met her husband Richard, also from Des Moines, at a very early age. They celebrated their 50th anniversary this year. They have 5 grown children who are all living in Denver. (Aren't they fortunate!) In reading Elaine's resume, one discovers that while Richard was pursuing his medical career in the Air Force and beyond, Elaine was raising a family and studying art. She began classes at the McChord Air Force Base. She

has studied under well-known artists including Cornelius Rutenberg (a Des Moines, Iowa artist featured in Women Artists in the US), Dale Chisman and Jordan Wolfson at the Art Students League in Denver, and Ricardo Mazal, an artist from Mexico.

In addition, Elaine is passionate about the design and preservation of historic public space and parks and serves on the Historic Denver Board. She founded the Civic Center Conservancy which is in the middle of a large renovation project (\$5.5 million), Re-imagining the McNichols Building. They envision the renovated McNichols building hosting community and arts events and being a vocal point of Civic Center Park.

Elaine loves large canvases filled with the excitement of color. About her abstract paintings, Elaine says, "The abstract comes from within. You don't have a model or a figure to paint from. I look at life as a laboratory from which I learn every day." We urge you to view her work in the Community Room of the Joint Public Safety Building. It will be on display through January. (Normal hours for that building are 8-4:30 Monday-Friday).

# Holiday Season Safety Tips

**T**he Holiday Season is a special time of year, and often this is also a time when busy people become careless and vulnerable to theft and other holiday crime. The Cherry Hills Village Police Department hopes that the following tips will assist in keeping everyone safe during the upcoming Holiday Season. You can never be too careful, too prepared or too aware.

## AT HOME

- Keep your garage door locked, especially ensure the side doors and/or rear entry doors are locked.
- Lock all outside doors and windows before you leave for vacation.
- Never leave your keys under doormats, in flower pots, mailboxes or any other “secret” hiding places. Burglars know where to look for hidden keys.
- An alarm system is excellent for home security. If you own an alarm system, make sure you activate your alarm before you leave for vacation. Also, provide the alarm company with an emergency contact; especially if you are going out of the country for your vacation.
- Indoor and outdoor lights should be on automatic timers while you are away.
- If you are away for an extended period of time, arrange for someone to shovel your driveway in the winter so it appears that someone is at home.
- Large displays of holiday gifts should not be visible through the windows and doors of your home.
- During your vacation, do not have daily deliveries (such as mail, newspapers or flyers, and packages) pile up while you are away. Have the Post Office hold your mail or arrange for someone to empty your mailbox and pick up your newspapers.
- If you are having any service performed

while you are gone (such as housekeeping or landscaping), make sure they secure your residence when they are finished.

- Have a responsible person check on your home frequently during your vacation.
- It is not uncommon for criminals to take advantage of the generosity of people during the holiday season by soliciting donations door-to-door for charitable causes although no charity is involved.

## SHOPPING

- Shop during day time hours whenever possible. If you must shop at night, go with a friend or a family member.
- Avoid wearing expensive jewelry.
- Even though you are rushed and thinking about a thousand things, stay alert to your surroundings.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash.
- Keep cash or credit cards in your front pocket.
- Notify the credit card company immediately if your credit card is lost, stolen or misused.
- Be extra careful if you do carry a purse or wallet. They are prime targets of criminals in crowded shopping areas.
- Avoid overloading yourself with packages. It is important to have clear visibility and freedom of motion to avoid mishaps.
- Beware of strangers approaching you for any reason. At this time of year, “con-artists” may try various methods of distracting you with the intention of taking your money or other belongings.
- If you are shopping alone, then you can ask mall or store security for an escort to your vehicle.

The Cherry Hills Village Police Department offers a housewatch program for all residents. It is a community program that allows residents to request additional police patrol of

their unoccupied residential property when they are on vacation or any other absence of the residence. To request this additional housewatch patrol, you can contact the Police Department at (303) 761-8711 during normal office hours (8:00-4:30 p.m.) and provide the following information:

- Name, address and telephone number
- Dates of departure and return
- Names and telephone numbers of emergency contacts
- Specific information regarding your residence, such as persons who have permission to go inside your residence, whether an alarm system will be activated, if lights will be on timers and if there will be any pets left at the residence
- Any other information that will assist officers monitoring your property

# RECREATION REIMBURSEMENT REMINDER

Please remember the deadline to submit your recreation reimbursement receipts for 2015 is January 15, 2016. **THERE ARE NO EXCEPTIONS TO THE DEADLINE** so be sure to submit your receipts early if you will be out of town on the January 15th deadline. If you belong to Greenwood Athletic Club and pay monthly dues, you are eligible for your \$500 reimbursement after 10 months; you do not need to wait until the end of the year to request your reimbursement. ## SPECIAL EVENT PERMITS

Special events bring groups of community members together for a variety of reasons and these events play a vital role in building goodwill in the Cherry Hills Village community.

Events or organized activities that involve street closures or include event components requiring the coordination of a number of city departments are reviewed through the citywide special event permit process. Examples of these events include festivals, parades, runs/walks, farmer's markets and other planned group activities; as well as events that are held in City Parks or on City trails.

You can find the Special Event Permit application on the City's website at [www.cherryhillsvillage.com](http://www.cherryhillsvillage.com). For small events we request that you submit the completed form at least two weeks before the event. For larger events, please notify the City at least two months before the event to allow for the coordination of every department. Completed forms can be faxed to the City at (303) 761-9386 or dropped off at the Village Center located at 2450 East Quincy Avenue Monday-Friday from 8:00-4:30 p.m. For questions regarding the special event permit process, please call (303) 761-8711.

The fact that it was very local and low key permitted residents to chat and enjoy the exceptional weather. One reason the Village got involved was to gauge the interest in the community for one or two Village sponsored farmers markets next summer.

We think the interest is there and thus, the City Council has authorized me to conduct an informal meeting or two to organize a farmers market program for consideration by the Parks, Trails and Recreation Commission and City Council. If you would like to assist in this endeavor

please let me know. If you are opposed to a small community farmers market, your input during a PTRC and/or City Council meeting will be helpful and informative. Nothing is planned which would compete with the Land Preserve's annual market held in conjunction with the Barn Tour.

Any neighborhood can apply for a special events permit through the police department to have a small area blocked from traffic for a short time in order to accommodate a fun event for the local community (see special event permits article on page 5).

Lastly on a more somber note, I returned from a business seminar composed predominately of women, held at the London Business School, on the day that Paris was the target of several terrorist attacks. I cannot lessen the horror of those events, but I am encouraged by the bright, caring and wonderful people from every religion and every region of the World that I met in London, all of whom care about making the World safe and productive. It is easy to forget that there are many multitudes of good people in the World when we see the horrible crimes perpetrated by those motivated by publicity, prejudice and power. I am not advocating that we ignore the slime of humanity whose goals are death and destruction. I am advocating, as we approach this holiday season, that we remember to reach out and thank those around us who actively work to seek harmony and peace in our communities and throughout the World. Many residents of Cherry Hills Village are involved in local, national and international charities. Their good work gets little press or attention, let us all remember to thank them.

# CITY FLOODPLAIN DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS AND NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

**S**ince 1978, the Village has participated in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) Community Rating System (CRS), making residents eligible for federally backed flood insurance and flood insurance discounts. In order to participate in this discount program, the Village has adopted minimum standards and regulations for floodplain development, conducts regular drainage way maintenance and provides community outreach on floodplain issues.

There are approximately 200 properties in the Village that intersect a floodplain designated on the FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) adopted by the City. If the residential structure on the property is located in a floodplain, flood insurance will be required by most mortgage lenders.

In Cherry Hills Village, most development in the floodplain is prohibited unless a special development permit is granted by the City Council. If you want to know if your property is in the designated floodplain or for more information on floodplain development permit requirements you can contact the Cherry Hills Village Community Development Department at (303) 783-2721 or stop by the Village Center at 2450 E. Quincy Avenue. The Village keeps records of

all current and past adopted floodplain maps and Flood Hazard Area Delineation (FHAD) areas, flood depth data for most currently mapped areas of the Village, and FEMA issued elevation certificates.

## Helpful Tips...

The following are helpful tips for residents who live in flood prone areas:

- ❖ Know the extent and nature of the flood hazard in your area.
- ❖ Plan escape routes to high ground.
- ❖ Buy flood insurance for your property.
- ❖ During times of heavy rainfall watch the level of water in the drainage way and stay tuned to radio or television for possible flood warnings.
- ❖ Evacuate the flood hazard area in times of an impending flood.

## UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS (UAS)

**C**ity Council is considering the establishment of regulations concerning the operation of “recreational” Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS) within the borders of Cherry Hills Village. City Council has determined that UAS, commonly known as drones, may be detrimental to the safety and welfare of residents; while invading privacy rights. Additionally, the improper operation of UAS can cause nuisances to wildlife, livestock and domesticated animals within the City. As the popularity and use of drones continues to rise, City Council wants to ensure that its residents have a mechanism in place that will protect their health, safety and welfare; while providing enjoyment of the pastoral nature that the community has fought so hard to protect. If adopted, these regulations will only cover “recreational” use of drones, the commercial use of these devices fall under the authority of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and are not subject to local control at this time.

On November 17, 2015, City Council passed on first reading Council Bill 09, Series 2015 a bill for an ordinance of the City of Cherry Hills Village Amending Chapter 7 of the Municipal Code to add a new Article VII concerning regulations applicable to the operation of Unmanned Aircraft Systems. City Council would like your input prior to the second and final reading of these proposed amendments to the City Code that will occur on Wednesday, December 9th at 6:30 p.m. You can find the Council Bill on the City’s website [www.cherryhillsvillage.com](http://www.cherryhillsvillage.com). City Council wants to protect its residents by keeping them safe and respecting their right to privacy while respecting the rights of those who wish to fly drones in a safe and lawful manner on their own property. Your comments and input will help shape how the City regulates and enforces the use of drones within the City.

## **CITY APPLIES FOR PARK AND TRAIL GRANT FUNDS**

**T**he City recently submitted two grant applications to Great Outdoors Colorado (GOCO) and Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW). The first request is for \$350,000 from GOCO to complete the engineering design and first phase of construction for John Meade Park and the Alan Hutto Memorial Commons. Development of the area will provide recreational activities for residents and visitors, as well as educational opportunities for local students. The first phase of construction will focus on improving the floodplain with new roadway crossings, demolition of existing structures and regrading of the site. The second request is for \$130,000 from CPW to construct a new section of the High Line Canal trail to the south of Hampden Avenue to accommodate two underpasses that are to be installed in 2017. The new section of trail is critical to the overall project as installation of the underpasses and extension of the existing trail will improve regional connectivity and user safety. Award announcements for both programs are expected in early spring.
