CITY HOLDS SUCCESSFUL SPRING CLEAN-UP EVENT

Once again the annual spring clean-up event was an enormous success. Residents dropped off over 4,000 pounds of latex paint and over 1,000 pounds of oil based paint. City employees also collected other materials such as fluorescent bulbs, alkaline batteries, aerosols and corrosive liquids during the drop off event on Saturday, May 3rd.

If you were unable to drop off your materials, the City has contracted Waste Management Curbside, LLC for a door-to-door recycling program for hazardous waste. This program is available for residents only and there will be a \$20 co-pay (residents may only use the service once per year). Funds are limited and the program will be suspended once all the funds have been used, so please use the service wisely. We encourage you to work with your neighbors and pool hazardous waste to maximize the available funds.

TREK THE TRAILS with PTRC & CHLP

The Parks Trails and Recreation Commission, is partnering with the Cherry Hills Land Preserve, to encourage all residents to get outside and take advantage of our incredible trail system. Did you know Cherry Hills Village has 26+ miles of trails? You and your family can walk your own marathon!

While exploring, try our Wildlife Spotting Feature to track the wildlife that you see along the way. Go online to www.cherryhillsvillage.com/parkstrailsmap and click on the interactive trail map link or scan the QR code found on City signage. Follow the instructions below to use the feature:




1 - Click the button to use the GPS on your device to locate yourself on the map.



2 - After locating yourself, click the button to bring up the wildlife spotting feature.

3 - Once open, click *New Feature* and select the location on the map where you would like to place the wildlife spotting report.



4 - Next simply fill in any relevant notes and click *Choose File* to add a photograph.

5 - Once done, click the *Close* button.

6 - Once you have clicked Close, the report will be submitted to City staff for review. Once staff has reviewed and approved your report, it will be visible to all users on the map!

MAYOR MUSINGS

This has been an eventful year thus far, but its summer time and I will keep it short (sort of like me).

Public Works has vacated the old fire station and moved all materials to the new site in Sheridan. The City Manager is working with Public Works to assure a smooth transition. The Village will be refurbishing a few old buildings located on the Sheridan site and will soon start construction on a fairly simple steel building for offices, lunch room and lockers. The site needs grading and preparation for vehicles which will be kept on site. Meanwhile, back at the ranch (so to speak) engineering progresses apace to assure applicable permits can be obtained for removal of the old public works facilities, cleanup of the site and improvement of the adjoining wetlands. Plans to fix up the old fire station (it is currently uninhabitable for any use other than storage) for temporary use as a City Administration building are also progressing. It will not be fancy, but is serviceable and much cheaper than construction trailers.

This spring we had many animals including coyotes with dens around the Village. Although most of the young is old enough to leave the dens, I would like to remind everyone not to feed wildlife. We protect wildlife by keeping it wild. If wild animals begin to expect food from people, this can lead to aggression when food is not forthcoming. To protect our wildlife please let it lead lives as wild as possible.

I continue to work diligently to protect our Village and surrounding communities from noise promulgated by the FAA proposed Denver Metroplex. This may be a losing battle, but I intend to go down fighting. Prior to expiration of the public comment period, Centennial Airport submitted a letter to the FAA objecting in great detail to Metroplex. Among their concerns is the noise that neighboring communities will experience. If you are interested, please go to the Village website where matters concerning Metroplex are posted;

including the letter from Centennial Airport. Centennial Airport is being a responsible neighbor and the letter reflects a concerted and very thoughtful effort to curb the negative impacts of Metroplex. Once I can clarify the impact with more specificity, I may be asking residents to write their Senators and Congress people. I will keep you posted.

Lastly, I will address traffic both within and without the Village. It is no secret that traffic throughout Denver is getting worse. Do not take too much comfort in the "no" vote in Greenwood Village. Extensive development will be occurring in Denver, Greenwood

Village and Centennial. City Council is planning a community meeting, possibly in September, to discuss the findings of the recently completed traffic study. In addition, Denver has volunteered to have a representative present to answer questions concerning adjacent developments. I would ask that you not shoot the messenger, it would be very rude.

Well, I guess this isn't as short as I had planned. Sorry. Have a wonderful rest of the summer.

CHERRY HILLS VILLAGE ADOPTS THE 2015 INTERNATIONAL BUILDING CODE SERIES

The International Code Series, National Electrical Code, and National Green Building Standards are updated every three years to keep pace with new technology and knowledge in construction practices. The City adopts the codes by reference with customized amendments to meet the City's unique needs. The following codes are proposed to be adopted by City Council on July 18th, each replacing the earlier version:

- 2015 International Building Code
- 2015 International Residential Code
- 2015 International Mechanical Code
- 2015 International Plumbing Code
- 2015 Fuel Gas Code
- 2015 International Energy Conservation Code
- 2014 National Electrical Code (currently adopted)
- 2015 International Fire Code
- 2015 Existing Building Code
- 2015 Green Building Standards

Adoption of the most recent versions of the International Code Series, National Electrical Code, and National Green Building



Standards help to ensure that the City's Codes address the latest building practices and technology, follow safe construction practices and provide high energy efficiency standards. The amendments to the Codes customize the regulations so that they address local requirements and regulations and include appropriate fee structures and procedures that will meet the City's needs.

The last day to submit under the 2012 International Building Code is August 4th. Any application submitted for review on or after August 7th will be reviewed using the 2015 International Building Code.
