She filled all our lives with the brightest colors of the rainbow. We love her now and forever.

HOLIDAY SEASON SAFETY TIPS

The Holiday Season is a special time of year, and often this is also a time when busy people can become vulnerable to theft and other holiday crime. The Cherry Hills Village Police Department hopes that the following tips will assist in keeping everyone safe during the upcoming Holiday Season. You can never be too careful, too prepared or too aware.

AT HOME

- * Keep your garage door closed and locked.
- * Lock all outside doors and windows before you leave your home.
- * Never leave your keys under doormats, in flower pots, mailboxes or any other “secret” hiding places. Thieves know where to look for hidden keys.
- * An alarm system is excellent for home security. If you own an alarm system, make sure it is activated. Also, provide the alarm company with an emergency contact.

- * Indoor and outdoor lights should be on automatic timers while you are away.
- * If you are away for an extended period of time, arrange for someone to shovel your driveway so it appears that someone is at home.
- * Large displays of holiday gifts should not be visible through the windows and doors of your home.
- * During your vacation, do not have daily deliveries (such as mail, newspapers or flyers, and packages) pile up while you are away. Have the Post Office hold your mail or arrange for someone to empty your mailbox and pick up your newspapers.
- * If you are having any services performed while you are gone (such as housekeeping or landscaping), make sure they secure your residence when they are finished.
- * Have a responsible person check on your home frequently during your vacation.
- * Be cautious of individuals going door-to-door asking for donations for charitable causes as it is a common scam used by criminals.

SHOPPING

- * Shop during day time hours whenever possible. If you must shop at night, go with a friend or a family member. If you are shopping alone during the evening hours, you can ask mall or store security for an escort to your vehicle.
- * Avoid wearing expensive jewelry.
- * Even though you are rushed and thinking about a thousand things, stay alert to your surroundings.
- * Avoid carrying large amounts of cash.
- * Keep cash or credit cards in your front pocket.
- * Notify the credit card company immediately if your credit card is lost, stolen or misused.
- * Be extra careful if you do carry a purse or wallet. They are prime targets of criminals in crowded shopping areas.
- * Avoid overloading yourself with packages. It is important to have clear visibility and freedom of motion to avoid mishaps.
- * Beware of strangers approaching you for any reason. At this time of year, “con-artists” may try various methods of distracting you with the intention of taking your money or other belongings.

RECREATION REIMBURSEMENT

REMINDER

Remember to submit your recreation reimbursement receipts for 2018. The City processes recreation reimbursement requests every two weeks. The deadline for submitting your 2018 recreation receipts is January 15th of every year. **There will be no exceptions to the January 15th deadline so residents are strongly encouraged to submit all receipts early.** If you belong to Greenwood Athletic Club and pay monthly dues, you are eligible for your \$500 reimbursement after 10 months; you do not need to wait until the end of the year to request your reimbursement.

As part of the recreation reimbursement program, residents have the option of donating their eligible reimbursement to the Catherine H. Anderson Land Donation fund. The money in the Cat Anderson fund is used to foster the preservation of natural open space and may also be used for other park

related purposes. Residents that would like to donate their reimbursements to the Cat Anderson fund will still need to complete a recreation reimbursement form and submit all eligible receipts to the City (be sure to indicate on the reimbursement form what portion of the reimbursement you would like to donate). All donations to the Cat Anderson fund are tax deductible and the City will automatically mail you a donation receipt.

Residents can drop off their reimbursement submittals Monday-Friday 8:00 am - 4:30 pm at the temporary City Hall (located at 120 Meade Lane) or mail them to 2450 East Quincy Avenue Cherry Hills Village, 80113 (**please make sure to apply enough postage, submittals that arrive with postage due will not be accepted**). Recreation reimbursement forms and receipts can be faxed to Pamela Broyles at (303) 761-9386 or emailed to pbroyles@cherryhillsvillage.com. HOUSEWATCH PROGRAM

The Cherry Hills Village Police Department offers a housewatch program for all residents. It is a community program that allows residents to request additional police patrol of their unoccupied residential property when they are on vacation or any

other absence of the residence. To request this additional housewatch patrol, you can contact the Police Department at (303) 761-8711 during normal office hours (8:00-4:30 p.m.) and provide the following information:

- Name, address and telephone number
- Dates of departure and return
- Names and telephone numbers of housesitter and emergency contacts
- Specific information regarding your residence, such as persons who may be visiting the residence, your alarm company, vehicles that will be parked at the residence, and animals at the residence
- Any other information that will assist officers in monitoring your property

Do you want to find out more about City news?

One of the features of the City's website is an integrated email notification system, called *Notify Me*. With *Notify Me* residents can be more specific in choosing which email notifications they would like to receive. If you only want to receive notification about important City events, you can sign up for City events only. Do you want to read the latest issue of the Village Crier online instead of receiving a paper copy? Only interested in receiving Board and Commission minutes and agendas? *Notify Me* allows you to customize the types of notifications you receive from the City so you only receive the emails that are most important to you. *Notify Me* is also the fastest way for City staff to notify residents of important City information, events and emergency alerts.

To sign up for *Notify Me*, you can visit the City's website at www.cherryhillsvillage.com. Click the link in the middle of the home page that says "Email Notifications". Once you click the link, you can enter your email address and select any type of notification you would like to receive via email (the website can send text messages too).
