GLENMOOR TRAFFIC SIGNAL

The City, in cooperation with the Glenmoor HOA, Glenmoor Country Club, City of Greenwood Village and CDOT, is installing a new traffic signal at Bellevue Avenue and Glenmoor Drive (which is Steele Street in Greenwood Village). The addition of any new signals must meet the criteria adopted by the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT). The traffic signal at Bellevue and Glenmoor Drive has been approved because the intersection meets the criteria outlined by CDOT based on several factors such as traffic volume and accident history.

The project has been funded through both public and private support. Once completed, CDOT will operate, maintain and time the signal to ensure that it is synchronized with the other signals on Bellevue Avenue. The signal will make access for both Cherry Hills Village and Greenwood Village residents safer and easier, especially at times of increased traffic. Construction of the signal has begun and will be complete in early 2020.

they are affiliated with. Unaffiliated voters may cast a ballot for any one political party. If an unaffiliated voter returns a ballot with more than one major political party, the ballot will be rejected and none of the votes will be counted. While each political party will still conduct caucus meetings, these meetings will not select presidential candidates.

Earlier this year, the City received calls from residents regarding the trimming of trees in various neighborhoods in the City. Xcel Energy periodically contracts arborists to perform work in and around power lines, which is necessary to ensure safe and reliable electrical service. The easements for utility services were put in place prior the construction of homes and planted trees. Unfortunately, homeowners will often plant trees in the utility easements without regard for future growth of the tree or realizing there are restrictions to what can be planted within these easements.

If you receive a notice or door hanger from Xcel and would like to speak to them prior to the pruning work being performed, it is crucial you contact them right away. The notice you receive on your front door should include the contact information for the arborist performing the services or you can contact Xcel directly at 1-800-895-4999. Any property owner can request a meeting to discuss the work required to maintain adequate clearances around the high-voltage lines; however, Xcel has the right to perform tree trimming in and around the power lines even if they are on your property. If the proposed pruning on your property is harmful to the health of the tree or trees, you may be able to request that Xcel remove the tree instead. This option must be approved by Xcel and cannot be approved by the arborist performing the work. If you have pets or a locked gate, you will also need to contact Xcel to coordinate the trimming.

MAYOR'S REPORT

This month a report on the Denver Metroplex final environmental assessment and several pending litigation disputes involving other Colorado cities having possible implications for our Village.

Metroplex Final Environmental Assessment

Following public meetings and hundreds of comments, the Federal Aviation Administration on November 18, 2019 issued its final Environmental Assessment for the proposed Denver Metroplex Project. The Final Assessment, and all public comments, is available at: http://www.metroplexenvironmental.com/denver_metroplex/denver_introduction.html.

Like the draft Environmental Assessment reported on in the June 2019 Crier, the Final Assessment noise modeling projects that the changes in flight patterns at DIA proposed in the "Preferred Alternative" will result in marginally *decreased* noise levels compared to the "No Action" alternative (see EA Technical Noise Report, Appendix I). A caveat is that both the Preferred and No Action alternatives are not adjusted for the expected overall increase in DIA flights in the coming decades. Another important caveat is that the Metroplex changes affect only aircraft using Instrument Flight Rule procedures. As much as 80 percent of the airplane traffic at Centennial Airport use Visual Flight Rules and are not part of the Final Environmental Assessment. With over 340,000 general aviation flights in 2018, Centennial Airport will create increased aircraft noise unrelated to the DIA traffic affected by the Metroplex Project. Village residents disturbed by aircraft overflight should file noise reports online with Centennial Airport <http://www.centennialairport.com/index.php/en-us/noise>.



Ethics Matters

Article 29 of the Colorado Constitution, approved by voters in 2006, adopts ethics rules for state and local government officials and employees.

The voter initiative stated that its provisions would not apply to home rule cities that have adopted ordinances "that address the matters covered by this article." In 2017 a citizen of Glendale (a home rule city like the Village) filed a complaint against the mayor with the State Ethics Commission.

The State Ethics Commission, somewhat surprisingly, concluded that it had jurisdiction despite the Article 29 carve-out, and commenced an investigation into whether Glendale officials had violated provisions of Article 29. Glendale responded by suing the State Ethics Commission, arguing that the city, having adopted its own ethics code, was not subject to Article 29 restrictions and did not have to answer to the State Commission. A trial judge agreed with Glendale and held that home rule cities like Glendale and Cherry Hills may adopt more, or less, stringent standards than those contained in Article 29. The State appealed, and the matter is now before the Colorado Court of Appeals.

Cherry Hills adopted a comprehensive ethics code in 2007. Our code contains simple, bright line rules for conduct. For example, the rules prohibit Council members from voting on matters in which they have a direct financial interest and prohibits the acceptance of any money or gift that might reasonably be interpreted as an attempt to influence an action or reward for past actions. These provisions are stricter than those in Article 29. The ability of the Village to enact and enforce its own rules for elected officials and staff (and not also be haled before the State Commission) is an important matter for our staff and volunteers.

Americans with Disability Act

Title II of the ADA mandates that no individual with a disability may be denied the benefits of the services, programs, or activities of a public entity. Suppose a city has sidewalk and curb cuts, created long before the ADA was passed by Congress, that creates a barrier to wheelchairs. Does the statute of limitations begin when the city initially installs the sidewalks (in which case it has no legal duty to repair)? Or does the city violate Title II *repeatedly* (each time a person with disability cannot use the sidewalk) until the city affirmatively acts to remedy the violation, e.g., fix the sidewalks? Whether Congress intended to require cities to fix all existing handicap barriers, or only to assure that all new facilities are ADA compliant, is a question that has divided federal courts. The United States Supreme Court may soon take up the issue based on litigation involving Trinidad, Colorado and settle the dispute. For older cities with limited budgets (like our Village) and many old facilities (unlike the Village), the ruling will have profound implications.

Door-to-Door Sales/First Amendment

Several years ago a pest-control company sued the Town of Castle Rock to challenge a 7 p.m. curfew for door-to-door salespeople. The curfew applied only to commercial vendors, and exempted charities, religious groups and political advocacy. Following several years of litigation and appellate argument a ruling from the Tenth Circuit is expected soon. A ruling upholding Castle Rock's ordinance would be good news for municipalities and citizens who would like the option to place reasonable restrictions for privacy and security on door-to-door sales.
