

NEW MILE MARKERS ON THE HIGH LINE CANAL

The High Line Canal Conservancy has installed the new mile markers along the High Line Canal trail in Cherry Hills Village! These mile markers are the first of many Canal enhancements recommended in The Plan for the High Line Canal, the guiding document endorsed by all jurisdictions. The Plan includes additional improvements such as wayfinding and interpretive signage, safer crossings, and stormwater management projects. These mile markers were generously funded by private donors through the Conservancy's Founding Partners program. Their locations have shifted slightly from that of the old markers, as they now match the mileage of the trail itself rather than the Canal.

Cherry Hills Village has the honor of having the midpoint of the Canal in our jurisdiction at Three Pond Park. A special marker will be placed at the midpoint once installation of all the mile markers is complete. Wayfinding signs are also planned for installation along the Canal later this summer to improve user navigation and share trail rules and etiquette. 


Tried and True Vegetables

Now is the time to consider which vegetables you want to grow this summer. Like many gardeners, you've probably been paging through the seed catalogs for months now. Maybe you've visited garden centers to peruse racks of seed packets. With so many choices, what are the best varieties for your garden? Arapahoe County Master Gardeners manage and maintain four vegetable demonstration gardens in the county. With years of trial (and some error) under our belts, we've narrowed down the field to some favorites.

CITY FLOODPLAIN DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS

and National Flood Insurance Program Requirements

The City has participated in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) Community Rating System (CRS) since 1978, making residents eligible for federal backed flood insurance and flood insurance discounts. In October 2017, the City was designated a Class 7 through the NFIP Community Rating System. While there are many benefits to CRS class designations, the most significant is lowered cost flood insurance rates. As a Class 7 community, residents of Cherry Hills Village are eligible for a 15% NFIP policy premium discount. CRS Classes are rated from 10-1 with a Class 1 being the highest level of floodplain management.

In order to participate in this discount program, the City has adopted

minimum standards and regulations for floodplain development, conducts regular drainage way maintenance and provides community outreach on floodplain issues. Cherry Hills Village is then rated on a 'credit point system' in order to determine eligibility for lowering the CRS Class. The City continues to work towards a lower rating and continues to expand our best management practices in dealing with floodplains. There are approximately 200 properties in the city limits that intersect a floodplain designated on the FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) adopted by the City. If the residential structure on the property is located in a floodplain, flood insurance will be required by most mortgage lenders.

In Cherry Hills Village, most development in the floodplain is prohibited unless a special development permit is granted by City Council. If you want to know if your property is in the designated floodplain or for more information on floodplain development permit requirements, you can contact the Cherry Hills Village Community Development Department at (303) 783-2721 or visit the City's floodplain page at: <https://www.cherryhillsvillage.com/386/Floodplain-Development>.

The Community Development Department maintains records of all current and past adopted floodplain maps and Flood Hazard Area Delineation (FHAD) areas, flood depth data for most currently mapped areas of the City and FEMA issued elevation certificates.

Helpful Tips...

The following are helpful tips for residents who live in flood prone areas:

- Know the extent and nature of the flood hazard in your area.
- Plan escape routes to high ground.
- Buy flood insurance for your property.
- During times of heavy rainfall watch the level of water in the drainage way and stay tuned to radio or television for possible flood warnings.
- Evacuate the flood hazard area in times of an impending flood.

MAYOR'S REPORT

This month an explanation of our unique Cherry Hills Village sales tax scheme.

A History of Sales Tax in Cherry Hills Village

Unlike most municipalities in Colorado, the Village's 3.5% sales tax is imposed **only** on vendors that **have a place of business in the Village** and who sell tangible personal property within the City. Code § 4-4-110. Sales taxes collected by the state and county (currently 4.25%) are the only sales taxes that must be paid when tangible personal property is sold by remote sellers (Amazon, Home Depot, Wayfair etc.) and delivered by common carrier to Village residents.

Our Village assesses no use taxes, except for a 3% tax on motor vehicles purchased by residents outside the Village for use or storage within the Village. Code § 4-5-20. A use tax generally operates like a sales tax with one difference – it is remitted directly to a city by the taxpayer. No use tax is due if a sales tax on a purchase has previously been paid to another jurisdiction.

Why does our Village tax sales made by our own businesses, but not sales by vendors shipping goods to us from Denver or Seattle? Why is there a “tax shelter” for foreign vendors but not our own? The answer is an accident of history involving United States Supreme Court flip-flops and the rise of on-line internet sales.

In 1965, Cherry Hills Village became a home rule municipality, organized and existing under Article XX, Section 6 of the Colorado Constitution. Under that provision, the state gave the Village authority to enact, administer and enforce taxes on personal property and services unless prohibited by the United States or Colorado Constitutions.

In 1967 and 1992, the United States Supreme Court ruled that states and cities could not force vendors who did not have a physical presence in the state to collect and remit sales taxes. *See, e.g., Nat'l Bellas Hess, Inc. v. Dep't of Revenue of State of Ill.*, 386 U.S. 753 (1967) (no state or city

may impose the duty of tax collection and payment upon a seller whose only connection with customers in the state is by common carrier or the United States mail); and *Quill Corp. v. North Dakota*, 504 U.S. 298 (1992) (“a vendor whose only contacts with the taxing state are by mail or common carrier lacks the ‘substantial nexus’ required by the Commerce Clause.”)

Thus when Cherry Hills Village was organizing itself, the states and cities could not require out-of-state (remote) vendors, **who did not have a physical presence in the state**, to collect and remit tax on sales or personal property to residents. Early on, our City Council enacted what is now in § 4-4-110 of the Municipal Code. That section imposes a sales tax “upon every vendor **having a place of business within the City** and who sells such property within the City.” This language echoes the physical presence rule of *Bellas Hess* and *Quill*.

Almost all other municipalities – with less fidelity to Supreme Court Commerce Clause teachings – imposed sales tax on all vendors **doing business** in a city. Of course, none of these cities could require remote vendors to collect or remit sales tax so long as *Bellas Hess* and *Quill* remained the law. But the older and broader limitation adopted by other municipalities would soon prove prescient.

Then, three years ago, everything changed. The Supreme Court in *South Dakota v. Wayfair, Inc.*, 138 S. Ct. 2080 (2018) *overruled* the physical presence test of *Bellas Hess* and *Quill*. South Dakota passed a law requiring remote sellers who deliver more than \$100,000 of goods or services into the state or engage in 200 or more annual transactions, to collect sales tax from buyers and remit to the state of South Dakota.

This time the Supreme Court upheld the South Dakota tax scheme. The Court's opinion discusses the dramatic technological change brought by the internet and on-line sales. Vendors like Amazon are now, because of the internet, “present” in states and municipalities in substantial and meaningful ways without



that presence being physical in the traditional sense of the term.

The Supreme Court reasoned that its physical presence rule had created an on-line sales tax loophole that placed businesses with physical presence at a competitive disadvantage relative to remote sellers.

As Justice Gorsuch wrote in his concurring opinion: “Today we put *Bellas Hess* and *Quill* to rest and rightly end the paradox of condemning interstate discrimination in the national economy while promoting it ourselves.”

In response to the *Wayfair* decision, the Colorado Department of Revenue in 2020 created a single point Sales & Use Tax System or “SUTS” to make it easy and efficient for remote sellers to collect and remit sales taxes to home rule municipalities. SUTS applies to all out-of-state vendors who have annual retail sales in Colorado of more than \$100,000.

Also in 2020, the Colorado Municipal League developed a Model Ordinance of Economic Nexus and Marketplace Facilitators that standardize definitions, reduces complexity, and provides clarity to remote sellers remitting taxes to home rule municipalities.

Virtually every neighboring home rule jurisdiction, including Denver, Greenwood Village, Lakewood, Littleton, Centennial, Lone Tree, and Sheridan, now have adopted SUTS and the Model Ordinance.

Our Village cannot join SUTS or adopt the Model Ordinance unless sales tax is extended to remote sellers. The Taxpayer Bill of Rights (TABOR) adopted by Colorado voters in 1992, requires any tax policy change to be approved by voters. As it now stands, our Village is the only home rule city in Colorado that taxes sales made by its **own businesses** but not purchases from business **operating from other jurisdictions**.
