MASTER PLAN ADOPTED

On December 14, 2022, the City Council approved the adoption of the 2022 Cherry Hills Village Master Plan. This adoption culminates nearly three years of work. During the project there was tremendous public participation that generated over 4,600 contacts with the public. Thank you, residents of Cherry Hills Village, for being invested in your community! A copy of the 2022 Master Plan and the associated documents are available on the City's website.


The Master Plan is a critical document that the City uses to help make decisions about a variety of things from funding capital improvement projects to making decisions on land use applications. Per Colorado state law, every jurisdiction is required to have a Master Plan (sometimes called a Comprehensive Plan). The Master Plan is a long-range policy document. It is standard practice for communities to update their Master Plan every five to ten years. The first Master Plan in the City of Cherry Hills Village was adopted in 1970 and was updated in 1993. In Memory of

Michael Dee Iseman

Dr. Michael Dee Iseman, 83, passed away on November 20, 2022 after a brief battle with cancer. He and his family have lived in the Village for 48 years.



Mike was born on March 3, 1939, in St. Paul, MN, but spent most of his early life in Fremont, NE. He earned a degree in history from Princeton

University, followed by a medical degree from Columbia Physicians and Surgeons. Mike served two years in the US Navy, completed his medical training in New York City, and then moved to Denver to raise his family and practice medicine.

Always a good athlete, in his 40s he was persuaded to try crew and went on to win a masters world championship with the team YOFRA. He coached and cheered his sons' Little League teams and was a lifelong Denver baseball fan, supporting the Bears and Zephyrs before being a 25-yr season ticket holder with the Rockies.

He served on the faculty of the University of Colorado Medical School and headed the tuberculosis program at National Jewish Hospital. Over his career, he traveled around the world and wrote the definitive textbook on the subject. His was inducted into the Halls of Fame for the American Thoracic Society and National Jewish Hospital.

Mike is survived by wife Joan, sister Toni, sons Matt and Tom, daughter-in-law Alexandra and granddaughter Claire.

CHERRY HILLS VILLAGE RECREATION REIMBURSEMENT RULES

Residents of Cherry Hills Village (primary residence only) who participate in a recreation program, activity, class or event offered by a municipal or special district recreation department, a non-profit youth sports organization or any municipal golf course located within the seven-county Denver metropolitan area (Adams, Arapahoe, Boulder, Broomfield, Denver, Douglas, Jefferson) may be eligible for a partial reimbursement of certain costs from the City of Cherry Hills Village. For purposes of this program, "youth sports organization" shall mean a sports organization whose primary purpose is to provide recreational activities for primary or secondary school students.

REIMBURSEMENT PROVISIONS

Each primary household in Cherry Hills Village is eligible for a maximum \$500.00 annual reimbursement when participating in an activity that qualifies for reimbursement. The amount of reimbursement shall be 50 percent of the cost incurred by the resident; however, reimbursement costs shall not exceed a maximum of \$50.00 per single activity, per resident to include memberships and passes. The purchase of a monthly membership, or multiple use pass is considered a single activity. The amount of reimbursement for an annual membership or pass shall be 50 percent of the cost incurred by the resident; however, reimbursement costs shall not exceed a maximum of \$500.00 annually per household. An annual membership is intended to designate a year-long membership and includes such facilities as Greenwood Athletic and Tennis Club and municipal recreation centers such as South Suburban. Seasonal sporting activities such as soccer, baseball, lacrosse, swimming, hockey, gymnastics, etc., are considered single activities.

REIMBURSEMENT PROCEDURE

1. Obtain an itemized receipt that includes the participant's name, address, name of agency, name of activity, activity fee(s) and activity date(s). Receipts must be for the year in which they are paid, not the year in which the activity takes place.

Note: The following will not be accepted as receipts: bank statements, cancelled checks, non-itemized credit card receipts, handwritten receipts and registration forms. Initiation fees, rentals, tax charged, national dues, merchandise, child care, travel, uniforms and golf carts do not qualify for reimbursement.

2. Complete the Recreation Reimbursement Form, attach all itemized receipts and mail or deliver this information to the Village Center by January 15th for the previous year's reimbursements. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

It is the resident's responsibility to ensure that all recreation reimbursement applications have been received by the City by 4:30 PM on January 15th.

All of the information above will be required and residency will be verified. It is the obligation of the City staff to ensure against abuse of this program and final authority will rest with the City Manager to suspend or eliminate reimbursement requests determined to be in violation of the terms of this program.




HIGH LINE CANAL STORMWATER STUDY

With the original purpose of conveying irrigation water to farms along the fringes of the Denver Metro area fading into the past, the High Line Canal is mostly dry these days. The primary use of the Canal today is as a recreational trail for bikes, equestrians, and walkers, along its 71-mile reach. Cherry Hills Village is working with Denver Water, the High Line Canal Conservancy, and other local jurisdictions to protect and preserve the Canal. The plan includes reusing the historical irrigation canal as a stormwater conveyance system. The entire Plan

for the High Line Canal can be viewed on the High Line Canal Conservancy website at <https://highlinecanal.org/plan/>. The visionary and collaborative plan reclaims the historic waterway for the region and depicts a new life for this legacy greenway.

The City desired to conduct further analysis of the stormwater conversion portion of the Plan as it pertains directly to the nearly four-mile segment of the Canal within the Village, as well as craft short and long-term strategies for capital improvements and annual maintenance costs of this segment of the High Line Canal. This analysis explored the risks and costs associated with utilizing the Canal for stormwater purposes. The report is a culmination of a year-long engineering study of the proposed High Line Canal Stormwater Conversion and concludes that the transformation of the High Line Canal within Cherry Hills Village from irrigation to stormwater conveyance is... “technically feasible through advanced engineering design and expert infrastructure construction.” Just as important as the engineering feasibility and risk mitigation, the report considers the capital construction and maintenance costs to help the City make informed decisions and forecast long-range budget impacts.



On December 14th the final report was presented to City Council and can be found on the City’s website at <https://www.cherryhillsvillage.com/hlcestormwater>. There is still much work ahead to formalize the conversion of the Canal and move the management of the stormwater and recreational uses of the entire High Line Corridor over from Denver Water to the local jurisdictions. The City will continue to work with all the partners to preserve and enhance the entire High Line Canal.

Art for John Meade Park

Installation Approved!

City Council has approved the installation of a three-sculpture series in John Meade Park. The Cherry Hills Village Art Commission selected acclaimed Colorado artist Joe Norman to design this custom sculpture series for the park. The Commission envisioned one of the sculptures being based on the monarch butterfly; the monarch is now endangered, but can be found in Cherry Hills Village in June on its way north and in September on its return migration to the south.

Mr. Norman's proposal includes a series of three 6' sculptures to be placed around the south pond in the park. The pieces appear to be local wildlife (a monarch butterfly, a broad-tailed hummingbird, and a Great Horned Owl) when viewed from one direction and playing children when viewed from a different angle. The artist's description of the sculpture theme is an inspiring message of resiliency, adaptability, and interdependence. The full proposal is available at cherryhillsvillage.com/art, and scale models of each sculpture (pictured here) are available to view at City Hall. Pictures and videos are also available on the CHVAC Instagram account, [@artinchv.](https://www.instagram.com/@artinchv/) This permanent series is intended to be the only art within John Meade Park.

The Art Commission plans to fund the sculptures primarily through community support. The three sculptures will total \$120,000 for fabrication and installation.

DOG LICENSE RENEWAL REGISTER AND PAY ONLINE.... IT'S QUICK AND EASY

The Cherry Hills Village Municipal Code requires every resident that owns a dog six months of age or older to obtain a City dog license. Licenses are valid for the calendar year and must be renewed annually. Dogs are required to wear the license any time they are off their own property and a rabies vaccination is required to obtain the license. A dog license helps reunite lost dogs with their owners, allows the Animal Control officer to regulate dangerous dogs, and encourages dog owners to vaccinate their dogs against rabies.

Residents can obtain a dog license online at cherryhillsvillage.com/dog; the cost is \$10.00 for every dog over six months of age, per year. Once the dogs have been registered and the payment has been processed, the Cherry Hills Village Police Department will mail the tag(s) to the address that was provided. Dog licenses are also available in person at the Joint Public Safety Facility located at 2460 East Quincy Avenue, Monday-Friday from 8:00-4:30 p.m. For questions regarding the dog licenses, you can contact (303) 761-8711 or email doglicensing@cherryhillsvillage.com.

HOUSEWATCH PROGRAM

The Cherry Hills Village Police Department offers a housewatch program for all residents. It is a community program that allows residents to request additional police patrol of their unoccupied residential property when they are on vacation or any other absence of the residence. To request this additional housewatch patrol, you can contact the Police Department at (303) 761-8711 during normal office hours (8:00-4:30 p.m.) and provide the following information:



Name, address and telephone number



Dates of departure and return




CANAL ETIQUETTE

SPECIAL EVENT LIQUOR PERMITS

Many fundraising events that take place in the City serve alcohol, and therefore may require a Special Event Liquor Permit per the City Code and Colorado law. Organizations should contact City Clerk Laura Gillespie at (303) 783-2732 or lgillespie@cherryhillsvillage.com with questions about specific event requirements.



Who is eligible for a special event liquor permit?

- An organization incorporated under Colorado laws for purposes of a social, fraternal, patriotic, political, educational, or athletic nature, and not for pecuniary gain.
- A regularly chartered branch, lodge, or chapter of a national organization or society organized for the purposes listed above and which is nonprofit in nature.
- A regularly established religious or philanthropic institution.
- A state institution of higher education.
- A political candidate who has filed the necessary reports and statements with the Colorado Secretary of State.
- Any municipality, county, or special district.
- A state agency, the Colorado wine industry development board, or an instrumentality of a municipality or county that promotes alcohol beverages manufactured in the state or tourism in an area of the state where alcohol beverages are manufactured.

When is a special event liquor permit required?

If an event is advertised to the public and alcohol is served, a special event liquor permit is required.

Events that do not require a special event liquor permit:

- A completely private event, that is not advertised to the public, where a set guest list is available, and at which there is no charge for alcohol (e.g., a wedding or graduation party).
- A private event on unlicensed premises for members and their guests of a qualifying organization where any admission or charge is uniform regardless of consumption of alcohol (e.g., a members-only event).
- A political fundraiser held in a private residence with no cash bar in operation.

What is the process for receiving a special event liquor permit?

- The Special Event Liquor Permit is separate from the City's Event Permit for use of City property. Public events on City property serving alcohol will need both types of permits.
- An application, supporting documentation, and fees must be submitted with the City Clerk at least 30 days prior to the event.
- Per State Statute, notice of the proposed permit and the procedure for protesting permit issuance must be conspicuously posted at the proposed event location for at least 10 days before approval by the City.
- If no objections are received during the 10-day posting period the City will approve the permit.
- If, after investigation and upon review of the contents of any protest filed, sufficient grounds appear to exist for a permit denial, a hearing before the City Council will be held on the application.

ANNUAL SECURITY ALARM PERMITS

The Cherry Hills Village Police Department will mail security alarm permit invoices in January.

All alarm permits can be paid on the City's website at cherryhillsvillage.com/pay using a checking account or any type of credit card. Instructions for paying the permit will also be printed on the invoice. If you have set up your Xpress Bill Pay account as an "auto pay account," you will receive a notification that an invoice is ready. Xpress Bill Pay will automatically debit the payment type that was originally attached to the account so you will not need to respond to the invoice, it is for informational purposes only.
