
DRUG TAKE-BACK EVENT

On Saturday, April 22nd from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. the Cherry Hills Police Department and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) will provide the public another opportunity to dispose of potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs. Bring your medications for disposal to the Cherry Hills Police Department at 2460 E. Quincy Ave. The service is free and anonymous, no questions asked.

It is important to remember that the following items are **NOT ACCEPTED** during these take back events. The items are as follows:

- Needles & Sharps
- Mercury (thermometers)
- Oxygen Containers
- Chemotherapy/Radioactive Substances
- Pressurized Canisters
- Illicit Drugs

This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse, and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. In addition, Americans are now advised that their usual methods for disposing of unused medicines—flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash—both pose potential safety and health hazards.

2023 Student “I VOTED” and “FUTURE VOTER” Sticker Contest



The Arapahoe County Clerk and Recorder's Office invites all students grades 1 through 12 to submit artwork for two new "I Voted" stickers and one new "Future Voter" sticker, to be used in the 2023 and 2024 elections. The contest is open to the public, private and home school students.

The contest is separated into three categories based on grade level:

- ★ Grades 1-5 will compete to design "Future Voter" stickers which are handed out at vote centers and events throughout the year.
- ★ Grades 6-9 will compete to design "I Voted" stickers included in mail ballot packets.
- ★ Grades 9-12 will compete to design "I Voted" stickers included in mail ballot packets.

MAYOR/COUNCIL REPORT

Hi. For those of you who don't know me, I am Randy Weil, CHV City Council Member from District 1 and Mayor Pro Tem.

For the six years I have been a Council Member it has been a privilege be part of the progress the City has made. It has also been terrific working with talented peers and staff unified around continuing the advancement of our unique City.

Let me bring you up to date on a topic that's near and dear to me, our Sales Tax Ballot Measure question 2A from last November. You will recall that the language in our Village Code needed to be modernized to conform with current business practices. Last summer, a group of concerned residents pulled together and worked hard to put the word out about why passing this measure was so important to the City's long-term financial future. They volunteered many hours and did a great job. With your support at the polls, the measure passed with 59% voter approval.

Your support permitted us to pursue joining the Colorado's Sales and Use Tax System (SUTS). As part of the landmark 2018 US Supreme Court Wayfair decision, sales tax could be collected on sales from remote sellers. However, states were required to automate the sales tax collection process

to avoid creating a hardship on merchants. SUTS does just that. It is a statewide system that can identify the correct tax jurisdiction (including state + county + municipal + special district) for any specific address. Prior to SUTS, CHV had residents who were charged different sales tax rates on shipments from a single vendor. That will not be a problem any more.

SUTS also provides a path to remit the sales tax collected by vendors to the correct municipality. More than a few residents wondered if CHV was receiving the municipal portion of the sales tax paid by them, me too!

With SUTS, we won't have to worry about that any more.

Director of Finance Doug Farnen and his team have a detailed timeline

of the various tasks required to implement 2A and join SUTS. The communications to merchants, software systems, and legal work to align the municipal code with the voted measure are more complex tasks than they might seem. Nonetheless, the City should be live on SUTS in late Q3.

Another project I'm excited about is moving from internal combustion engines to electric powered vehicles and equipment where feasible. I serve on the Denver Regional Council of Governments (DRCOG) Board and one of the hotter topics is greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions.

The Denver region's air quality does not compare favorably with pretty much the rest of the country and world. More specifically, if we don't reduce our GHG emission levels substantially in order to meet Federal requirements, the Denver region is at risk of losing a large portion of our Federal highway funding which totals \$350-\$500M.

CHV has always been a "good citizen." To help mitigate GHG emissions, the City is exploring replacing aging City vehicles with electric vehicles (EVs). Price premiums are coming down and electric power is now finding its way into specialty vehicles,

e.g. police cruisers, pick-up trucks, etc. Public Works is already using a few different small pieces of electric equipment to gain experience. My personal experience with EVs has been low maintenance, low fuel cost, high

reliability, quiet and great acceleration. We are being deliberate (evolution, not revolution) and I am excited about the future.

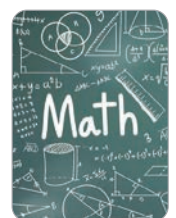
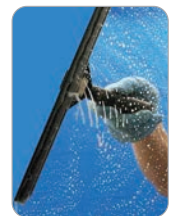
