# Ready for a Refresh? Try These in Your Garden.

Plant aficionados are always on the hunt for new introductions as well as undiscovered plants that offer diversity, interest and beauty to a garden. Now is the chance to try these out and add a little zhuzh to your garden.

## Color

The Eastern Redbud Flame Thrower® is a new cultivar of the dramatic small tree that already grows in our area. Flame Thrower starts the season with a profusion of pink flowers that come out on bare branches before the leaves emerge. Its small size works well as an accent tree at 15-20' tall and 15' wide. It provides interest throughout the season with glossy heart-shaped leaves that start out as burgundy, then change to red and finally turn to orange, yellow and green as they age. All five colors are displayed on the tree simultaneously throughout the growing season. It is waterwise and attracts bees, butterflies and birds.

## More Color

A multi-colored (6'x 6') showy shrub that was recently introduced is Winecraft Black® Smokebush. Like the Redbud Flame Thrower, it provides a



kaleidoscope of colors throughout the season. Foliage emerges in a rich purple and turns near black with burgundy undertones during the summer heat. It blooms early to mid-summer and has large soft blooms that are pink with red highlights resembling wispy smoke. In the fall, leaves turn to shades varying from brick red to orange. It is tolerant of many soil types provided they are well drained. Smokebush prefers a sunny location and is repellent to deer and rabbits.


## Pollinators

If you are looking for a shrub to support birds, bees and butterflies, consider Hydrangea arborescens Bee Friendly™. Be aware that not all varieties of hydrangeas are beneficial to insects, but this one is. Smooth hydrangeas have white, dome-shaped flower heads made up of numerous small flowers in clusters up to 4" wide. They grow to a height of 3'-4' and spread 4'-6' wide and prefer partial shade.



## Fragrance

Pink on Repeat™ lilac is a 2025 introduction by Plant Select® that blooms twice in a season, providing more bang for the buck. Pink on Repeat lilac was found to have survived the harsh winters in neighboring Wyoming with only natural precipitation. It blooms twice a year! The first fragrant bloom is mid-May to June and then again in August. It starts out as a dark pink flower that fades to light pink and then white. This lilac grows 5'-6' high and spreads 8'-9'. It is resistant to deer and good for pollinators.

# MAYOR'S REPORT

Nowadays it seems that “government” is just a euphemism for “cramming your ideas down everyone else’s throat.” Our leaders seem to be blind and deaf to half the population, one way or another. Depending upon your political leanings, this may resonate with you for different reasons. Colorado Attorney General Phil Weiser, on March 16, posted on Facebook that he was proud of his “work defending the rule of law and protecting Colorado against executive branch overreaches by the Trump Administration.” Ironically, he hasn’t said anything about, or defended Colorado from, the gross unconstitutional overreaches by the Colorado legislature led by Governor Polis. Our state government has been running rough shod over local governments, of all political leanings, for the past four years. Now that the shoe is on the other foot, our state leaders don’t seem to like how it feels. To me, it feels like karma. What used to be a partnership between levels of government – local, county, state and federal – has deteriorated into camps of people all trying to exert their power over those below them, and often exceeding their authority.

Last year, the Democrats in the Colorado Legislature, led by Governor Polis, exceeded their authority by passing a slew of laws that blatantly violate the Colorado Constitution and infringe on local communities’ rights to home rule. Local governments, of all political persuasions, were united in opposition to those laws, but our voices fell on deaf ears; our state leaders were intent on pushing their own agenda regardless of the input from our communities. They

were more concerned with using their power to turn Colorado into California with no respect for the Constitution or their constituents. A few of the most egregious examples with potentially devastating impacts to Cherry Hills Village were:

**HB24-1313:** This new law attempts to require us to dramatically increase housing density to allow a **minimum** of 40 units per acre in large swaths of Cherry Hills Village. Not only would that destroy the semi-rural, low-density character that Cherry Hills Village residents value above all else, but it would more than double the number of housing units in, and population of, our city. Such extreme growth would place enormous strain on our infrastructure and municipal services.

**HB24-1152:** This law requires communities to allow multiple residences on every lot currently zoned single-family residential in conflict with our current zoning and even private HOA covenants. Again, this law could radically increase the number of homes and population in the city beyond our capacity to provide services.

**HB24-1007:** This law prohibits cities from placing restrictions on the number of unrelated people who can live in a home. Problems have already arisen in Grand Junction where a home in a neighborhood similar to Cherry Hills Village is being used as a residence for 20 men with psychiatric and criminal backgrounds and court-related problems.

**HB24-1304:** On top of the above laws requiring drastic increases in multi-family housing, this law prevents cities from requiring any parking associated with that housing. You read that right...**no parking requirements.**

And unfortunately, our legislature is at it again this year. HB25-1169 would allow religious institutions and public schools to circumvent zoning laws (that everyone else has to follow) to build housing on their property. In Cherry Hills Village, we have 10 such institutions

that hold almost 100 acres of land. If this bill passes, Cherry Hills Village could be looking at thousands of additional housing units on top of the thousands of units allowed by last year’s legislation.

Taken in totality, these bills could more than quadruple the number of homes and people living in Cherry Hills Village. Neither the City nor you, the residents, would have any input in or control over that growth.

**These laws represent an existential threat to our community.** Just as the Governor and Attorney General have vowed to protect Coloradans from what they perceive as federal overreach, the Cherry Hills Village City Council is **absolutely committed** to protecting our residents from this gross state overreach. **We will do everything in our power to protect and defend the values of Cherry Hills Village**, as expressed by our residents over the decades and in our Master Plan. It is our firm belief that, as a home rule municipality, our citizens, through our elected City Council, have the sole authority to regulate land use within Cherry Hills Village. Your City Council will continue to exercise that authority on your behalf and implement the vision you have laid out for us in the Master Plan.

As Mayor, I deeply regret the erosion of trust and partnership between local and state government, but I take heart in the fact that we are not alone. Cities around the metro area, and even the state, regardless of their political alignment or even how they feel about these policies, are united in standing up for home rule authority and local control of our own communities. In Cherry Hills Village, serving on City Council is not about cramming our beliefs down your throat, it is about giving your beliefs a full-throated voice. And we will join the chorus of other municipal voices to defend our right to self-governance to the bitter end if necessary.

## Floodplain Development Regulations and National Flood Insurance Program



The City has participated in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) Community Rating System (CRS) since 1978, making residents eligible for federally backed flood insurance and flood insurance discounts.

To participate in this program, the City has adopted minimum standards and regulations for construction in the floodplain, conducts regular drainage way maintenance, and provides community outreach on floodplain issues. Cherry Hills Village is then rated on a point system whereby the total number of points equates to an overall rating. The overall ratings range from 1 to 10 with a 1 resulting in the most discount to flood insurance. The City's current rating is a 7, which means Village residents are eligible for a 15% discount for their flood insurance rates. The City continues to work towards a lower rating and to expand our best management practices in dealing with floodplain related issues.

There are approximately 200 properties in the Village that intersect a floodplain designated on the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) adopted by the City. If a structure is located in a floodplain, flood

insurance will be required by most mortgage lenders.

In Cherry Hills Village, most development in the floodplain is prohibited unless a floodplain variance is granted by City Council. If you want to know if your property is in the designated floodplain or for more information on any new construction in the floodplain, you can contact the Cherry Hills Village Community Development Department at (303) 783-2721, stop by the Village Center at 2450 E. Quincy Avenue, or visit the City's Floodplain page at: [cherryhillsvillage.com/386/Floodplain-Development](http://cherryhillsvillage.com/386/Floodplain-Development)

The Community Development Department maintains records of all current and past adopted floodplain maps and Flood Hazard Area Delineation (FHAD) areas, flood depth data for most currently mapped areas of the City and FEMA issued elevation certificates.

### Helpful Tips...

The following are helpful tips for residents who live in flood prone areas:

- Know the extent and nature of the flood hazard in your area.
- Plan escape routes to high ground.
- Buy flood insurance for your property.
- During times of heavy rainfall watch the level of water in the drainage way and stay tuned to radio or television for possible flood warnings.
- Evacuate the flood hazard area in times of an impending flood.
