crime scene investigation and arrest control techniques, among many others. # State legislature passes House Bill 25-1056 further limiting a local jurisdiction's ability to regulate wireless communication facilities.

During the 2025 legislative sessions the legislature passed House Bill 25-1056 and Governor Polis has signed the bill into law. The Bill automatically approves certain co-location wireless construction if a local jurisdiction does not meet certain timeframes for reviewing and approving the application. Additionally, the Bill strips local governments of the ability to require co-location or siting applications or additional permits for the modification, removal, discontinuance, or replacement of wireless service facilities and the associated equipment. Finally, the Bill gives a telecommunication or broadband provider the right to use municipal light poles, traffic signals, and utility poles that are in the right-of-way for small cell facilities.

Small cell facilities, defined as facilities that are located in public right-of-way, and having each antenna being not more than 3 cubic feet in volume, and the other wireless equipment being not more than 28 cubic feet in volume, are already preempted by federal legislation. Meaning that a wireless provider installing a small cell facility in the right-of-way that met the size requirements is allowed by-right without the local jurisdiction being able to deny the installation. Cherry Hills Village does have a spacing requirement (600 feet) and a height requirement (50 feet) for small cell facilities, but those requirements trigger a public hearing and not denial. As the technology for small cell facilities advances, it is likely communities across the country, including Cherry Hills Village, will see more of these facilities.



## Indicator Weeds Are a Clue

A perfect green carpet of turf is the goal for many homeowners. Yet every year we fight weeds in our lawns and every year they come back — a seemingly never-ending battle. With a little detective work and some changes to your lawn care program, you can keep those weeds at bay often with no herbicides necessary.

Good lawn care practices are the first and best defense against weeds in your lawn. A thick actively growing lawn will choke out most weeds. That means proper watering, fertilizing and mowing. But you may not know that you can use the types of weeds growing in your lawn, called indicator weeds, to give you an idea of what could be going wrong with your lawn.

If you see prostrate spurge, knotweed, mouse-ear, annual bluegrass and chickweed in the lawn, the soil is compacted. To correct this, core aerate your lawn twice per season for two or three years to break up the compaction.

Crabgrass, yellow wood sorrel and white clover are a sign that your mower is set too low. Make sure your mower height is at least 2 inches – 2.5 to 3 inches is best.

Too little water encourages dandelions, black medic, bindweed and stink grass. Check your irrigation system to make sure it's properly covering the area. If poor coverage isn't the problem, increase the amount of water.


On the flip side, overwatered lawns invite annual bluegrass, crabgrass, violets and ground ivy. Make sure your sprinklers aren't running too long or too often.

Too much fertilizer and you'll find curly dock, henbit, yellow wood sorrel and annual bluegrass. Best practice is to fertilize in May to mid-June, September and November using only the amount recommended for your turf type. Too little fertilizer and too much water makes ideal conditions for black medic, plantain and white clover. Cut back on the water and fertilize your lawn.

Herbicides are an option for controlling weeds until the changes you've made to your lawn care take effect. If you have only a few weeds, dig them out or spot treat them rather than applying herbicide to the entire lawn. Apply herbicides on a calm, clear day when the temperature is between 50 and 85 degrees. Don't apply if it will rain in the next 12 hours and don't irrigate for 12 hours after application. And, most importantly, always read and follow all directions on the herbicide label. The National Pesticide Information Center is a great source of information on herbicides and pesticides. If you have questions, you can call or chat online with one of their experts.

CSU Extension has published a list of recommended grasses and weed ID books, keys and apps for Colorado to help identify the indicator weeds in your lawn. With a little time and effort, you can have the best-looking, practically weed-free lawn in the neighborhood!

# MAYOR/COUNCIL REPORT

## My First Five Months on Council

Cherry Hills Village is fortunate to have a solid tax base and a long-term plan supported by a balanced budget, enabling us to accomplish goals outlined in the City's Master Plan.

### Key Issues We've Tackled So Far

In our first five months, Council has addressed several significant issues, including:

- Responding to state-mandated housing and rezoning initiatives from Governor Polis and the State Legislature—potentially the most consequential policy challenge facing our Village in the years ahead.
- Exploring ways to improve cell phone coverage while maintaining our serene, semi-rural character defined in the Master Plan.
- Evaluating the future of Quincy Farm, including updating its vision and long-term plan.
- Approving major projects such as the Glenmoor Country Club renovation and the Kent Denver gym rebuild.
- Addressing traffic concerns and initiating plans for a comprehensive Village-wide traffic study in 2026.
- Reviewing fencing code requirements along major roads such as University, Hampden, and Belleview.

Each of these topics plays a vital role in maintaining the high quality of life that defines Cherry Hills Village.

### A Tale of Two Trends

Lately, I've been reflecting on two seemingly contradictory observations. Our Police Department's Citizens Academy has seen tremendous engagement, with recent graduates expressing how much they learned and how meaningful the experience was. I attended their graduation in June and was deeply moved by the level of community support for both the Academy and our officers.



At the same time, we've seen a low amount of interest in openings on our City's Boards and Commissions. This gap presents a real opportunity for residents to get involved and make a difference.

### Ways to Get Involved

Cherry Hills Village has several Boards and Commissions that are essential to our community's operations, including:

- Board of Adjustment and Appeals
- Planning and Zoning Commission
- Parks, Trails, and Recreation Commission
- Cherry Hills Village Art Commission

These groups generally meet once a month for 2-3 hours at the Village Center. They're made up of your neighbors—smart, engaged, and fun people who care about the future of our city. Joining one of these boards is a rewarding way to give back.

Applications are available on the City website ([cherryhillsvillage.com](http://cherryhillsvillage.com)), and the City Clerk keeps all applications for two years in case of openings. Residents must have lived in the City for three years at the time of appointment to a City board or commission.

In addition, Arapahoe County operates more than a dozen advisory boards and commissions that benefit from the participation of skilled local residents.

### My Own Path to Service

My own journey of civic involvement in Cherry Hills began with the Citizen Advisory Taskforce for the Master Plan, which is a document that provides the 20-year vision and plan for the Village. Serving on that committee alongside Mayor Pro Tem Earl Hoellen and Councilor Rob Eber was engaging, thought-provoking, and even entertaining at times. It deepened my appreciation for our community and inspired me to run for Council.

Cherry Hills Village is home to many accomplished individuals—residents with valuable experience and, in some cases, the capacity to dedicate a few hours each month to public service. I urge you to consider stepping into one of these roles. ## City Launches 2025 Mill and Overlay Project Starting July 8<sup>th</sup>

The City of Cherry Hills Village will begin its 2025 Mill and Overlay Project on **Monday, July 8, 2025**, as part of its ongoing efforts to maintain and improve local road infrastructure. This year's project will focus on resurfacing several key roadways to enhance safety, extend pavement life, and provide a smoother driving experience for residents and visitors.

The following roads are scheduled for resurfacing:

- E Quincy Avenue
- S Holly Street
- Colorado Boulevard
- Sedgwick Drive
- Mockingbird Lane

During the mill and overlay process, the existing asphalt surface will be removed (milled) and replaced with a new layer of asphalt. This proven maintenance method helps restore road quality while being cost-effective and minimally disruptive compared to full reconstruction.

Drivers can expect temporary lane closures and detours in affected areas throughout the project. The City encourages residents to plan accordingly and follow posted signs and flaggers to ensure safety for all.

Ahead of construction, residents are also asked to trim trees and vegetation that overhang the street or sidewalk to accommodate equipment access.

# City Road Maintenance

## Part 3 – Pavement Condition Index


### What is a Pavement Condition Index?

A Pavement Condition Index (PCI) is a numerical rating system that ranges from 0 to 100, where 0 represents the worst possible condition and 100 represents the best possible condition. It is based on a survey of the pavement's surface, identifying and quantifying various types of distress such as cracks, potholes, and surface wear, year of construction, and last maintenance application. The PCI helps in determining the maintenance and rehabilitation needs of each pavement section. This system is widely used in transportation engineering and asset management to prioritize and fund pavement maintenance activities. The process is still somewhat subjective and needs to be completed in a consistent and impartial manner to be effective. The use of computer-generated data has begun to make the City's process more consistent and will continue to improve over time as more data is collected. The City's average PCI is 78/100.



### How is PCI Calculated?

PCI is determined through detailed surveys of pavement surface distresses. These surveys identify the types of distress (e.g., cracking, rutting), their severity, and their extent. The data collected is then used to calculate a “deduct value” for each type of distress. These deduct values are summed up and subtracted from 100 to give the PCI score. The Decision Tree below shows how the program utilizes the collected data to make repair and maintenance decisions once the PCI is calculated.



### The Importance of PCI

A PCI is a simple and effective communication tool for conveying pavement conditions. However, it should not be the sole basis for selecting pavement treatments. As is mentioned above, the system still requires a professional assessment of actual conditions to be efficient. A PCI when combined with in the field assessments can lead to better decisions and more cost-effective pavement management.

Performing preventative maintenance when a street's PCI is in the 70-85 range is the most cost-effective and helps avoid more expensive repairs later. Preventive maintenance can significantly extend the pavement's lifespan and improve overall performance. This industry accepted standard is what has been utilized by the City to create its current Integrated Pavement Management Program and long-range budgeting forecast.

## Sculptures in the City

Since its inception in 2011, the Art Commission (CHVAC) has solicited loans of sculpture from artists for display in the City. Loan periods are typically for at least two years and the artist is paid a stipend for their work.

The CHVAC is recommending the City enter into an agreement for the two-year loan of three sculptures by artist Pard Morrison. They are titled *Love Beacon*, *Warm Fuzzy*, and *Honey in Sunlight* and are approximately 6 feet, 8 feet, and 10 feet tall. The proposed placement is in front of City Hall along Quincy Avenue facing Cherry Hill Elementary School, in the approximate location that the current sculpture on loan, *Windsong III*, sits right now. **City Council will consider the sculpture-on-loan agreement at their meeting on July 15<sup>th</sup>.** If approved by City Council, these pieces will be installed in August.
