

APPENDIX C: COMMUNITY SURVEY

C.1 ONE PAGE SUMMARY OF RESULTS

As part of the Cherry Hills Village Master Plan process a community survey was conducted in March of 2008. Three hundred sixty seven household surveys were completed as part of the random sample representative survey effort. Below is a brief overview of key findings by survey topic. The survey is one of several public participation tools being taken into consideration as the goals and strategies for the master plan are being formulated.

Transportation / Traffic

Survey results indicate that respondents are more concerned with problems relating to traffic entering and exiting the Village than traffic flowing through the Village or in their neighborhood and that they are generally satisfied with traffic flow. The majority of respondents were supportive of reducing cut through traffic even if it meant adding to their drive time.

Parks / Open Space / Trails / Recreation

Overall, survey respondents are highly supportive of Parks, Open Space, Trails and Recreation in the Village. A high percentage of respondents are satisfied with Natural Open Space and Recreational Trails, while there is less satisfaction with Paved Trails along Village Streets and Active Recreational Parks. The highest percentages of respondents were supportive of preserving land for passive recreational parks, natural open space, views of natural features and public trails. Survey respondents prefer donation of private land; requirements for land dedication; and changes to zoning, building and subdivision regulations and requirements as means for preserving land. About half of the respondents support preserving land for active recreational parks.

Building / Zoning

The survey results indicate that a majority of respondents would support changes to zoning and building regulations that preserve the character of the Village, with the majority of those in support having concerns about the impacts. Approximately a third of respondents said they would not support such changes whether there are potential impacts or not.

Village Center

The largest percentage of respondents wanted community spaces in addition to functions existing today at the Village Center. The top four additional community spaces supported in the survey results are Community Meeting Room, Community Recycling Center/Area, Small Postal Service Center and Outdoor Community Gathering Space. The Community Survey results indicate that approximately a third of the respondents were unaware of the Citizens City Center Committee report regarding a new village center.

Future Funding and Actions

The majority of respondents are comfortable with the current allocation of revenues. If Village revenue became unstable, respondents would tend to support (in order of preference) reallocating funds, incorporating limited commercial development in certain parts of the Village, increasing taxes or fees or decreasing the level of services provided. Respondents preferred that Village reserve funds be used for the following purposes (in order of preference): parks/trail/open space acquisition, continued use as a reserve fund, burying electric and utility lines, and road and traffic improvements to reduce cut through traffic.

C.2 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Overview of the Methodology

Cherry Hills Village conducted a citizen survey during March and April of 2008 as part of an effort to update its Master Plan. The Master Plan is intended to serve as a strategic guide for local decision making and will include goals and policies related to the development of the City. The survey was designed to obtain statistically valid results from households throughout Cherry Hills Village. The survey was administered by a combination of mail and phone.

Leisure Vision worked extensively with Cherry Hills Village officials, as well as members of the Gould Evans project team in the development of the survey questionnaire. This work allowed the survey to be tailored to issues of strategic importance to effectively plan the future system.

In March of 2008, Leisure Vision mailed surveys to a random sample of 1,500 households throughout Cherry Hills Village. Approximately three days after the surveys were mailed, each household that received a survey also received an electronic voice message encouraging them to complete the survey. In addition, about two weeks after the surveys were mailed, Leisure Vision began contacting households by phone. Those who indicated they had not returned the survey were given the option of completing it by phone.

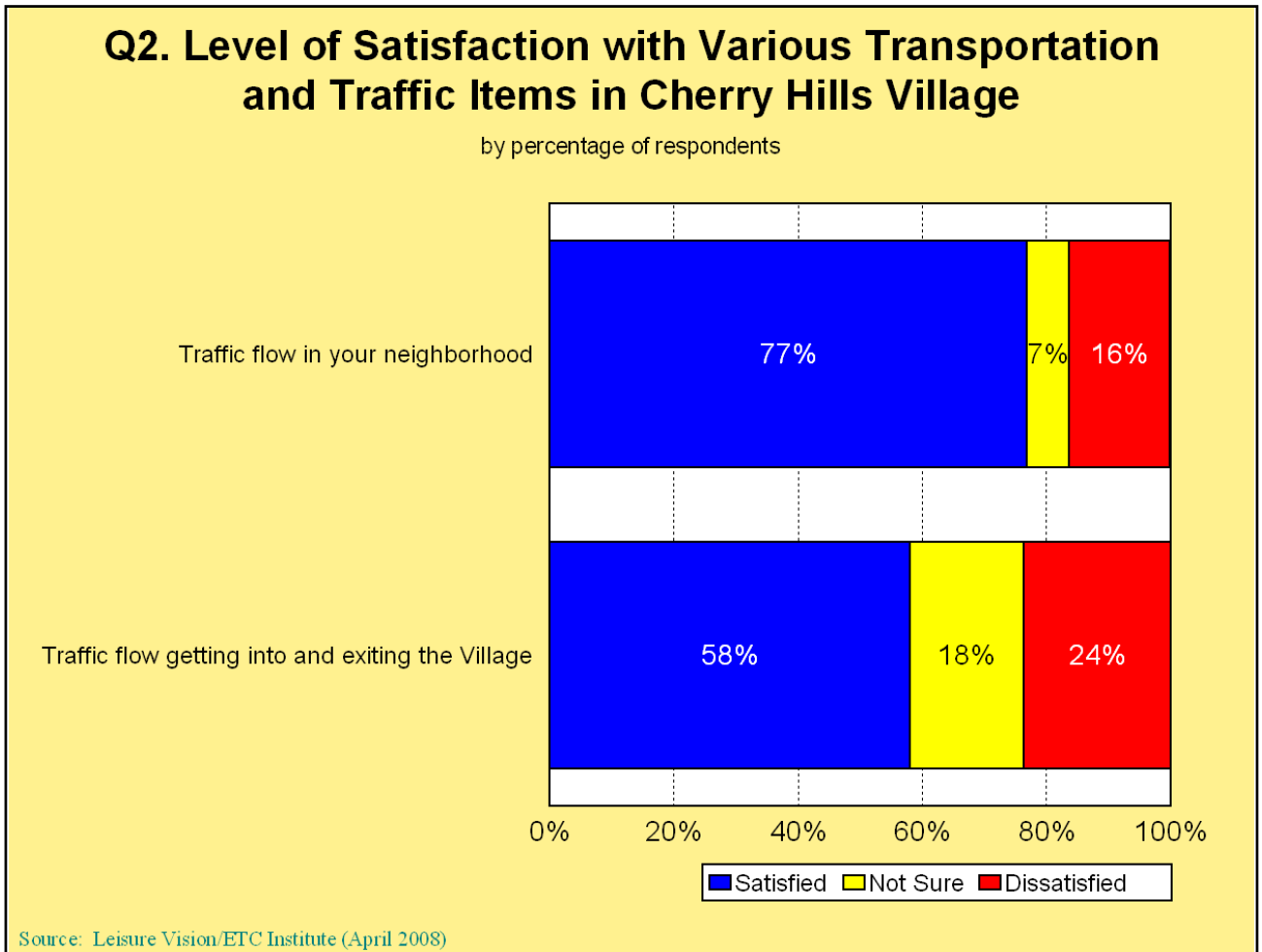
The goal was to obtain a total of at least 300 completed surveys. This goal was accomplished, with a total of 317 surveys having been completed. The results of the random sample of 317 completed households have a 95% level of confidence with a precision of at least +/-5.5%.

Level of Satisfaction with Various Traffic Items

From a list of two transportation and traffic items in Cherry Hills Village, respondents were asked to rate their level of satisfaction with each one. The following summarizes key findings:

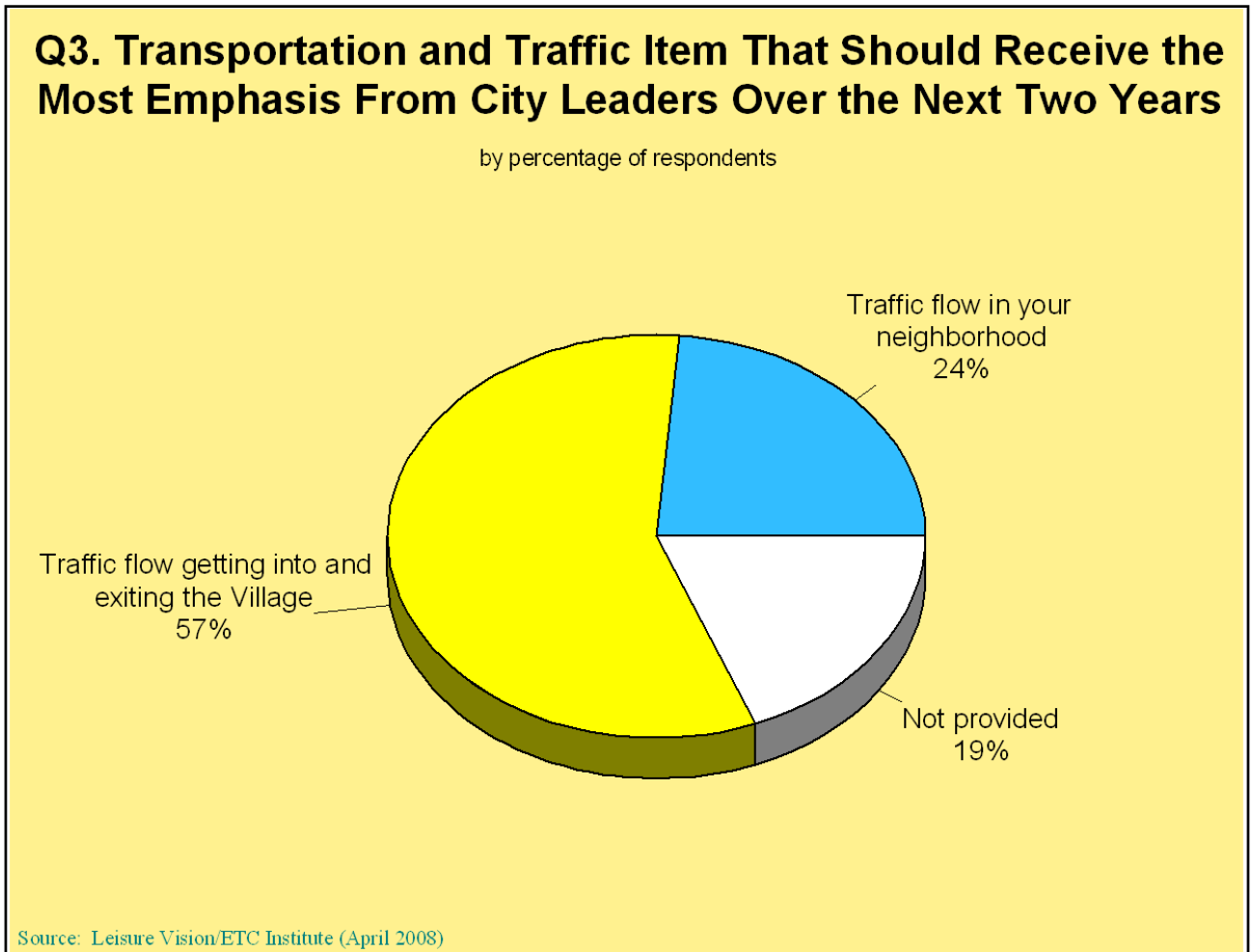
- Seventy-seven percent (77%) of respondents are very satisfied with the traffic flow in their neighborhood. Fifty-nine percent (59%) of respondents are very satisfied with the traffic flow getting into and exiting the Village.



Traffic Items That Should Receive the Most Emphasis from City Leaders

From a list of two transportation and traffic items in Cherry Hills Village, respondents were asked to select the one item that should receive the most emphasis from City leaders over the next two years. The following summarizes key findings:

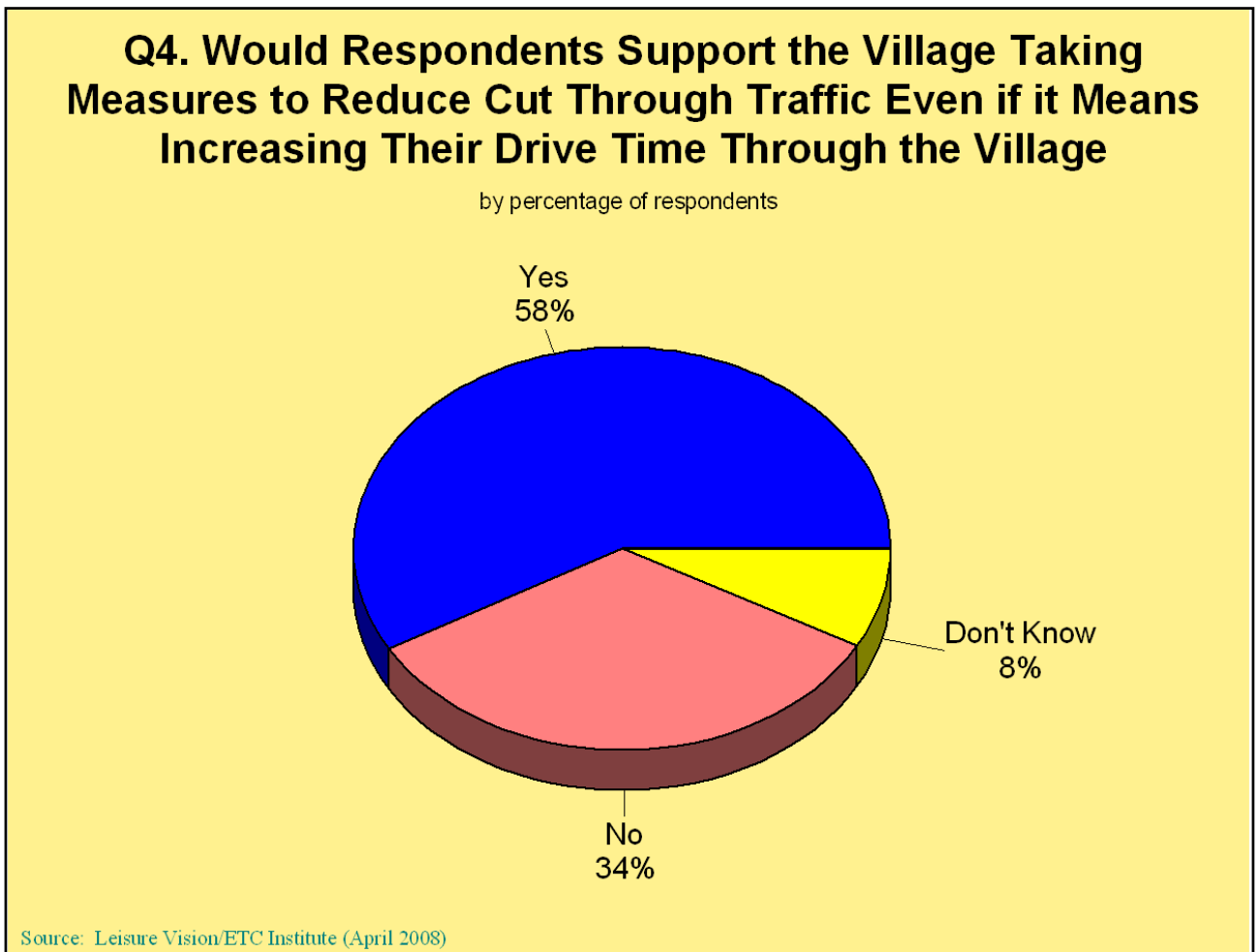
- Fifty-seven percent (57%) of respondents feel that traffic flow getting into and exiting the Village should receive the most emphasis from City leaders over the next two years. Twenty-four percent (24%) of respondents feel traffic flow in your neighborhood should receive the most emphasis, and 19% did not provide a response.



Support for the Village Taking Measures to Reduce Cut Through Traffic

Respondent households were asked if they would be supportive of the Village taking measures to reduce cut through traffic even if it might increase their drive time through the Village. The following summarizes key findings:

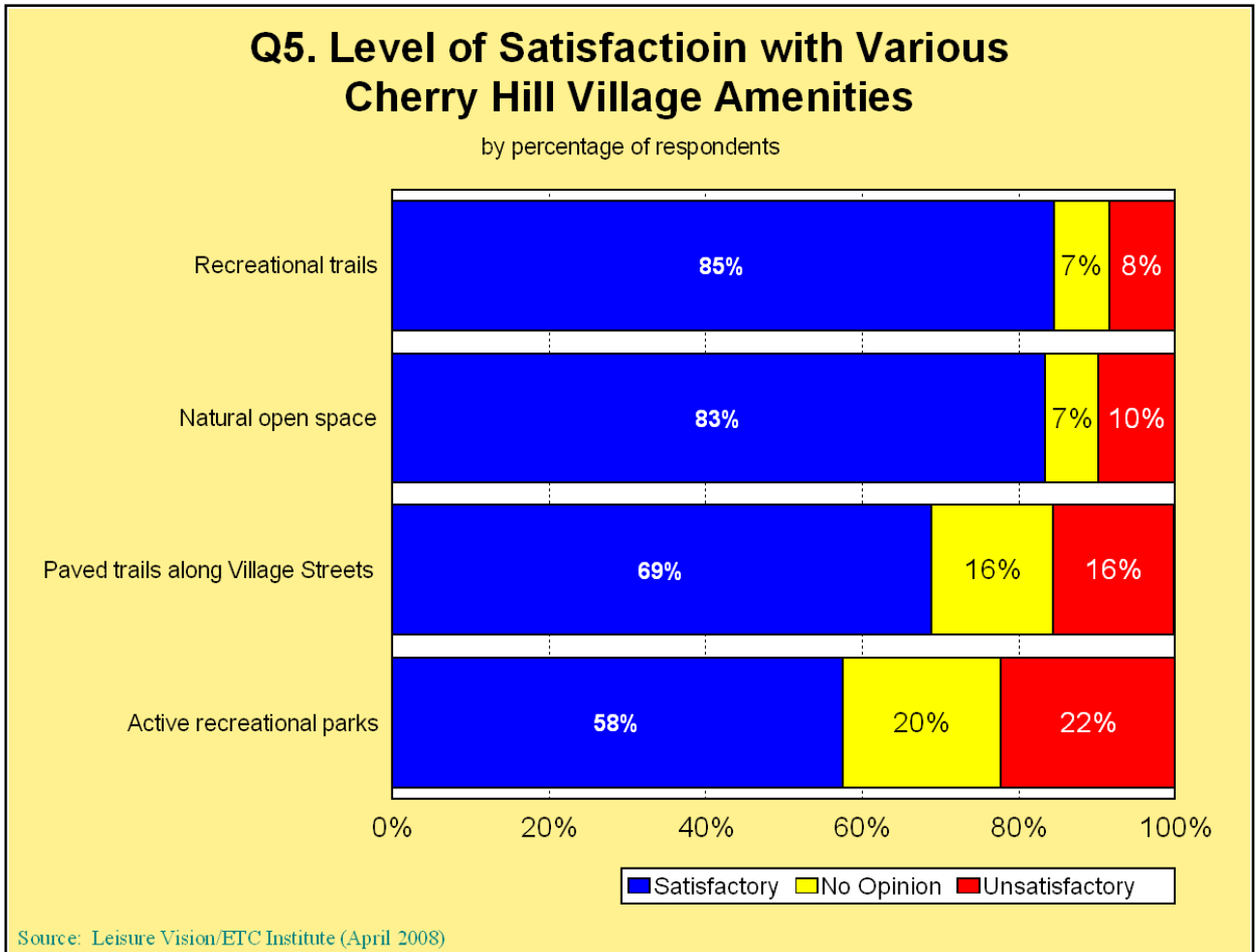
- Fifty-eight percent (58%) of respondent households are supportive of the Village taking measures to reduce cut through traffic, even if it might increase their drive time through the Village. Thirty-four percent (34%) of respondents are not supportive of taking measures to reduce cut through traffic, and 8% indicated "don't know".



Level of Satisfaction with Various Cherry Hill Village Amenities

From a list of four various Cherry Hills Village amenities, respondents were asked to rate their level of satisfaction with each one. The following summarizes key findings:

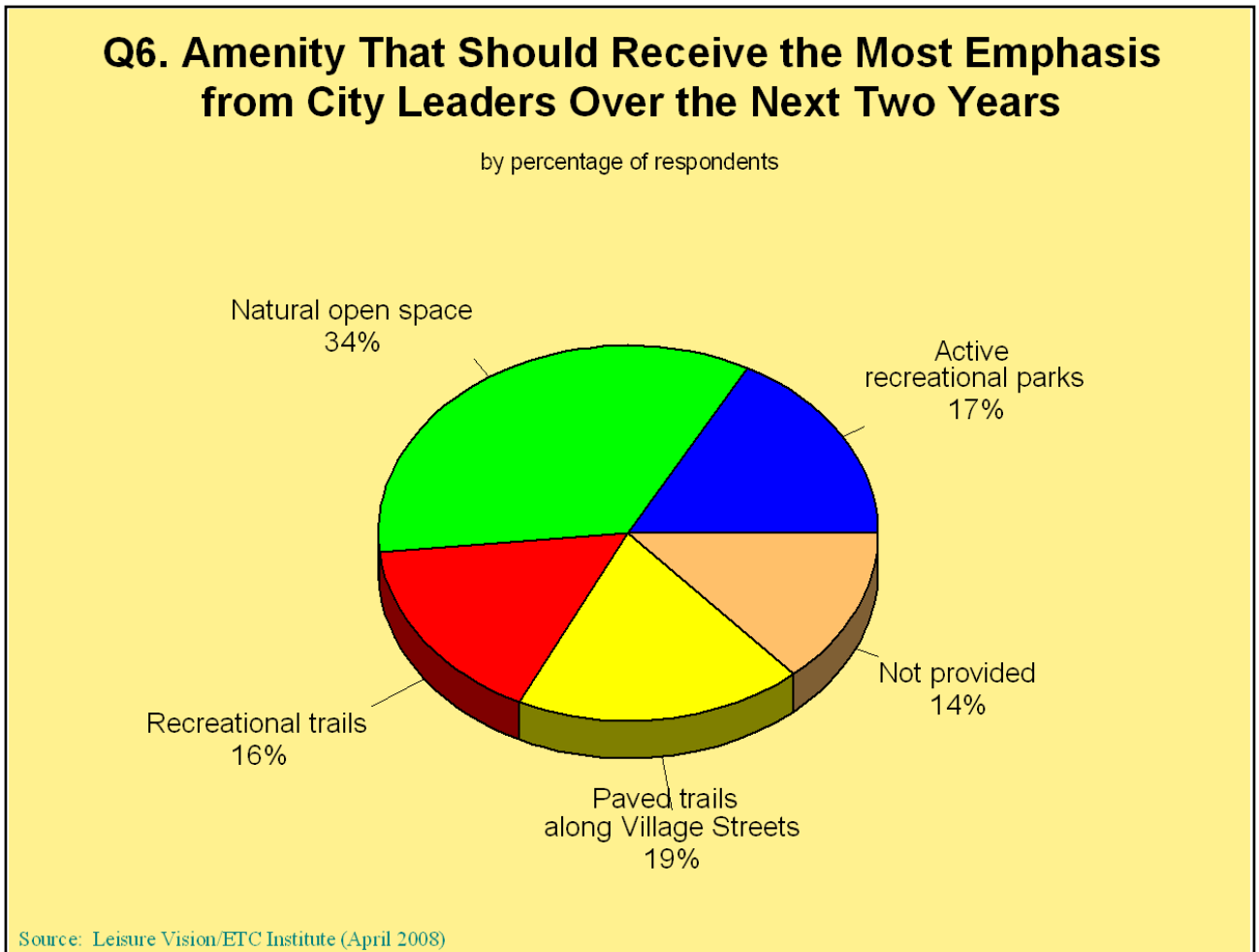
- Over 80% of respondents rated recreational trails (85%) and natural open space (83%) as satisfactory. Sixty-nine percent (69%) of respondents rated paved trails along Village Streets as satisfactory, and 58% of respondents rated active recreational parks as satisfactory.



Amenities That Should Receive the Most Emphasis from City Leaders

From a list of four various Cherry Hills Village amenities, respondents were asked to select the one amenity that should receive the most emphasis from City leaders over the next two years. The following summarizes key findings:

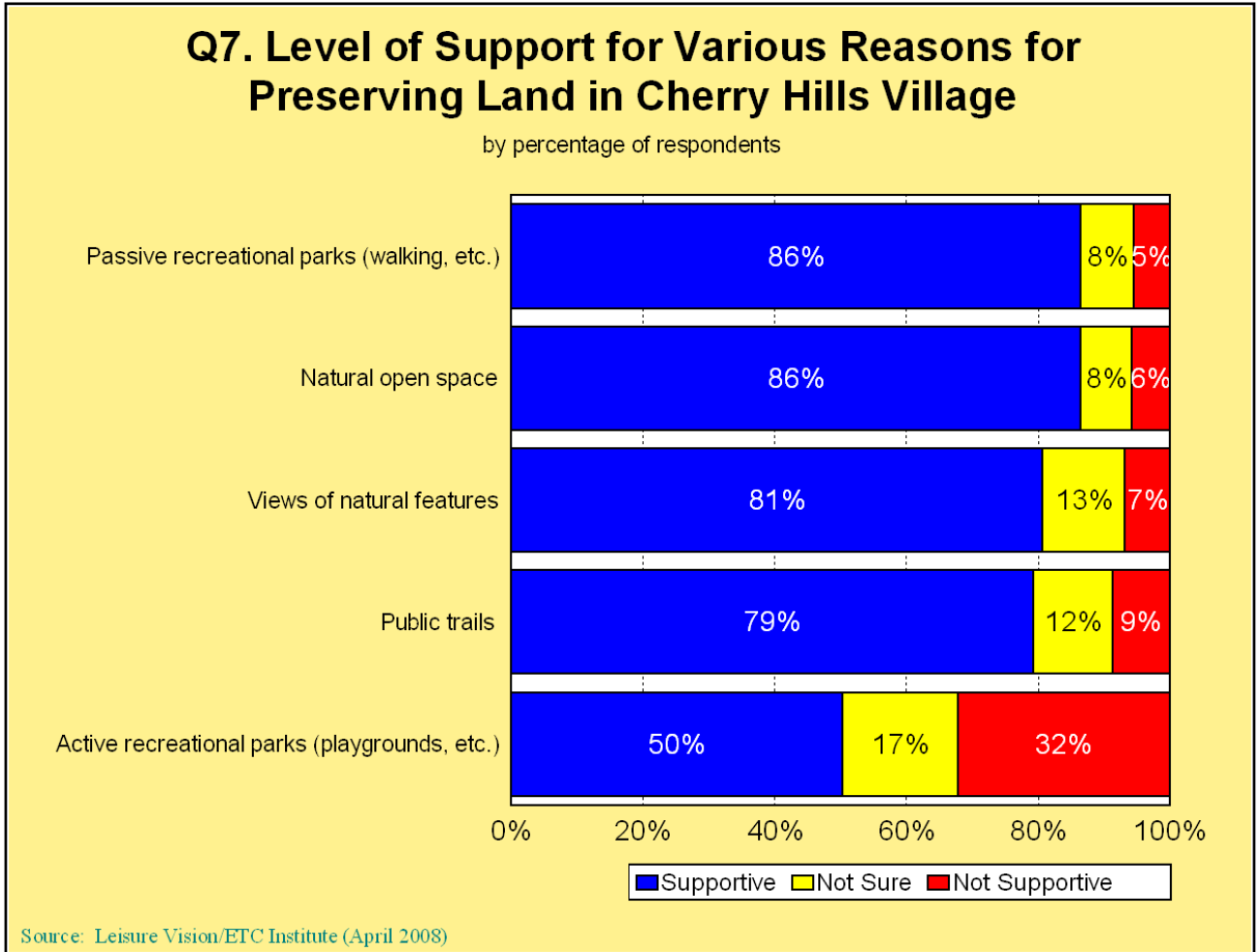
- Thirty-four percent (34%) of respondents selected natural open space as the amenity that should receive the most emphasis from City leaders over the next two years.



Level of Support for Various Reasons for Preserving Land

From a list of five reasons Cherry Hills Village could preserve land, respondents were asked to rate their level of support for each one. The following summarizes key findings:

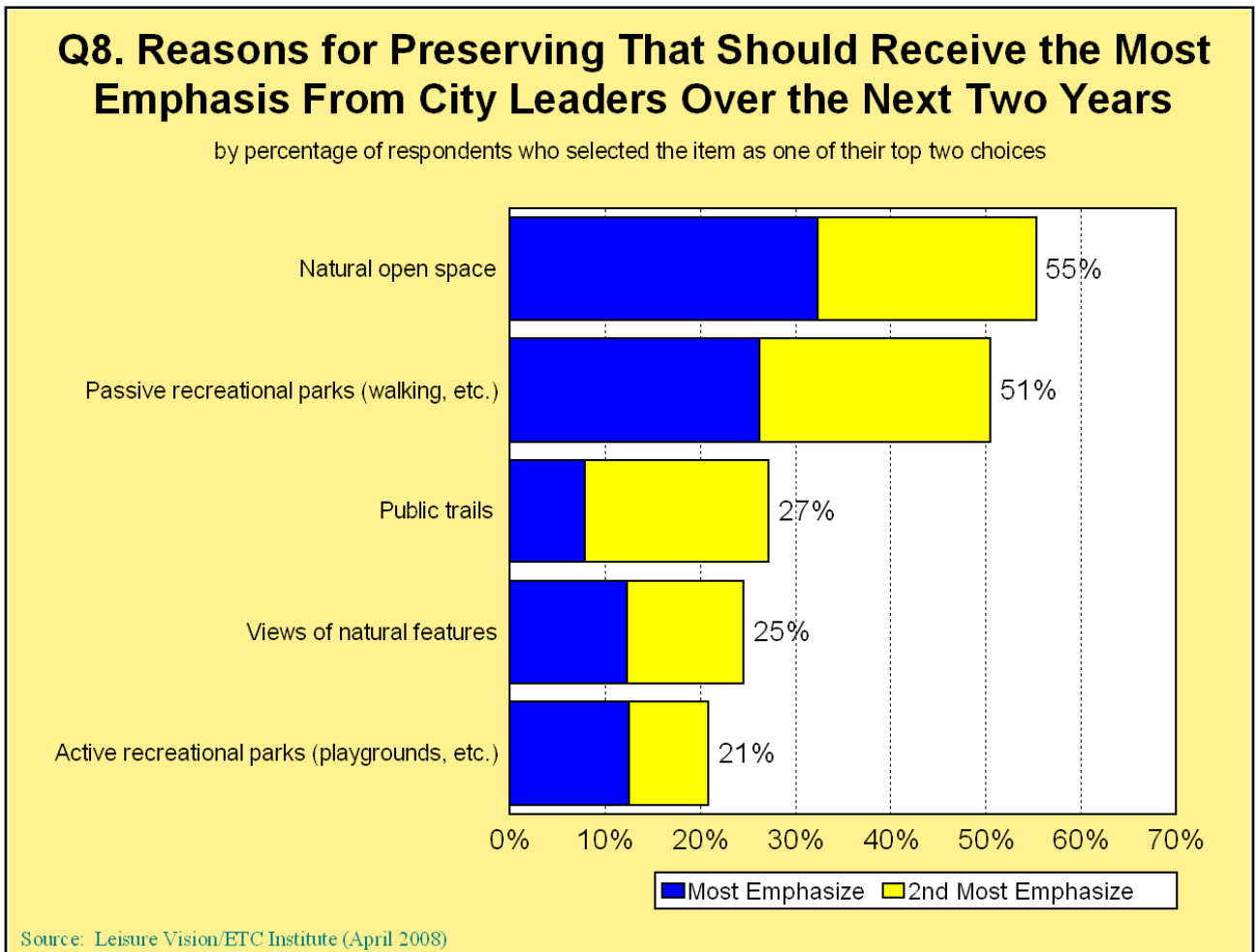
- Over 75% of respondents are supportive for four of the five reasons to preserve land: passive recreational parks (86%), natural open space (86%), views of natural features (81%) and public trails (79%).

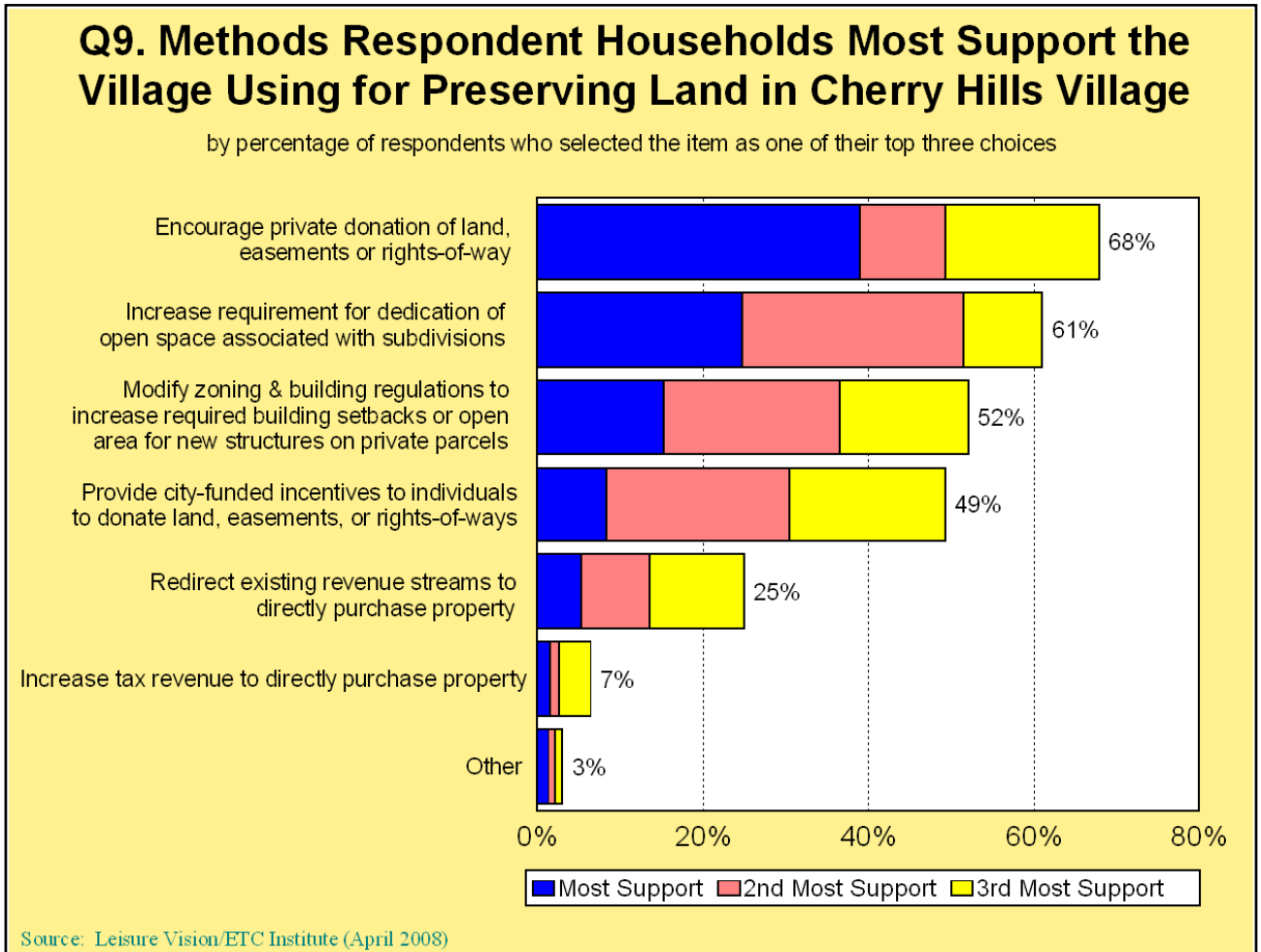
- Based on the sum of their top two choices, the reasons to preserve land that respondents feel should receive the most emphasis from City leaders are: natural open space (55%) and passive recreational parks (51%).

From a list of six options, respondents were asked to select the three methods they would most support for preserving land in Cherry Hills Village. The following summarizes key findings:

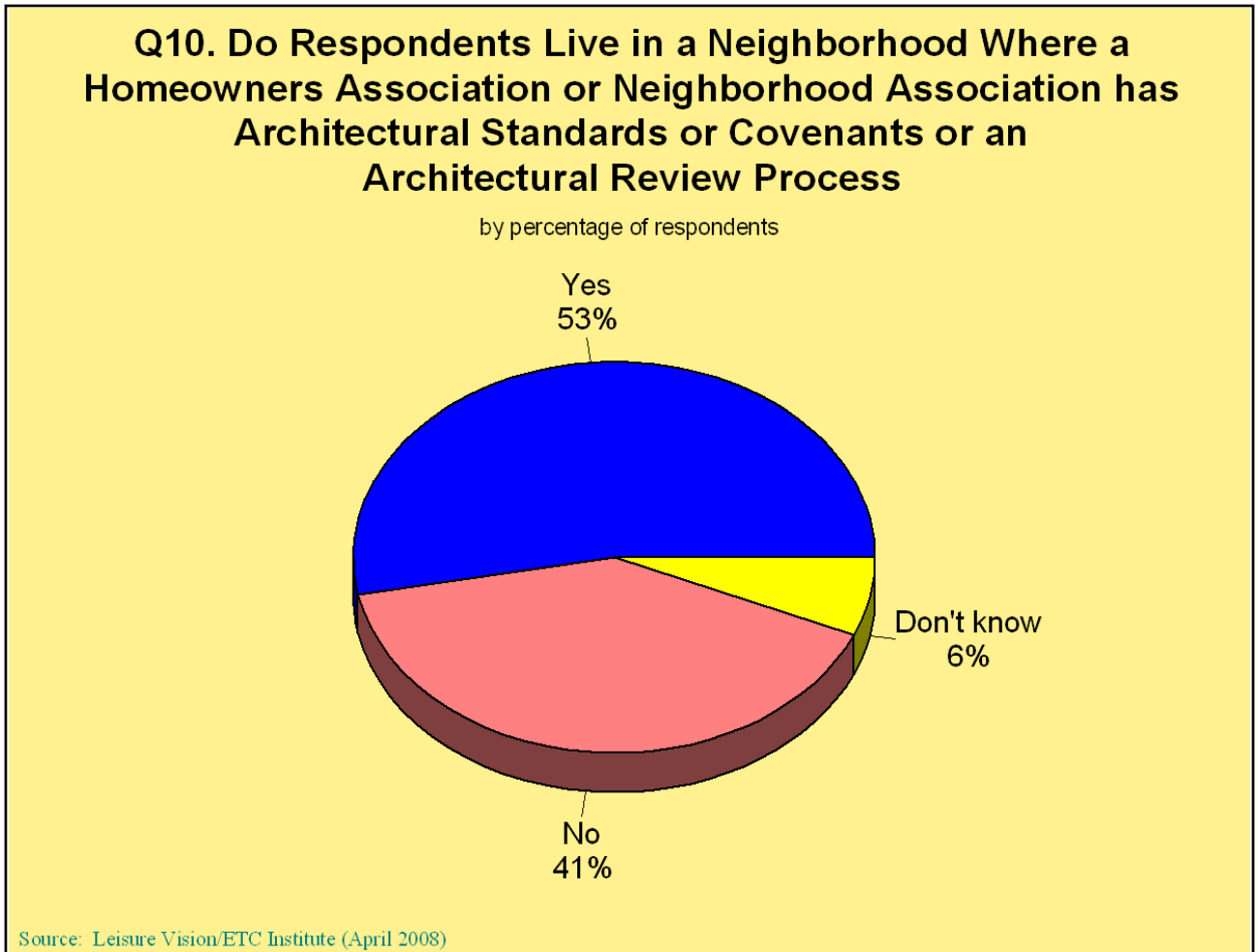
- Based on the sum of their top three choices, the methods respondents would most support for preserving land in Cherry Hills Village are: encourage private donation of land, easements or rights-of-way (68%) and increase requirement for dedication of open space associated with subdivisions (61%).



Living in a Neighborhood with Architectural Standards

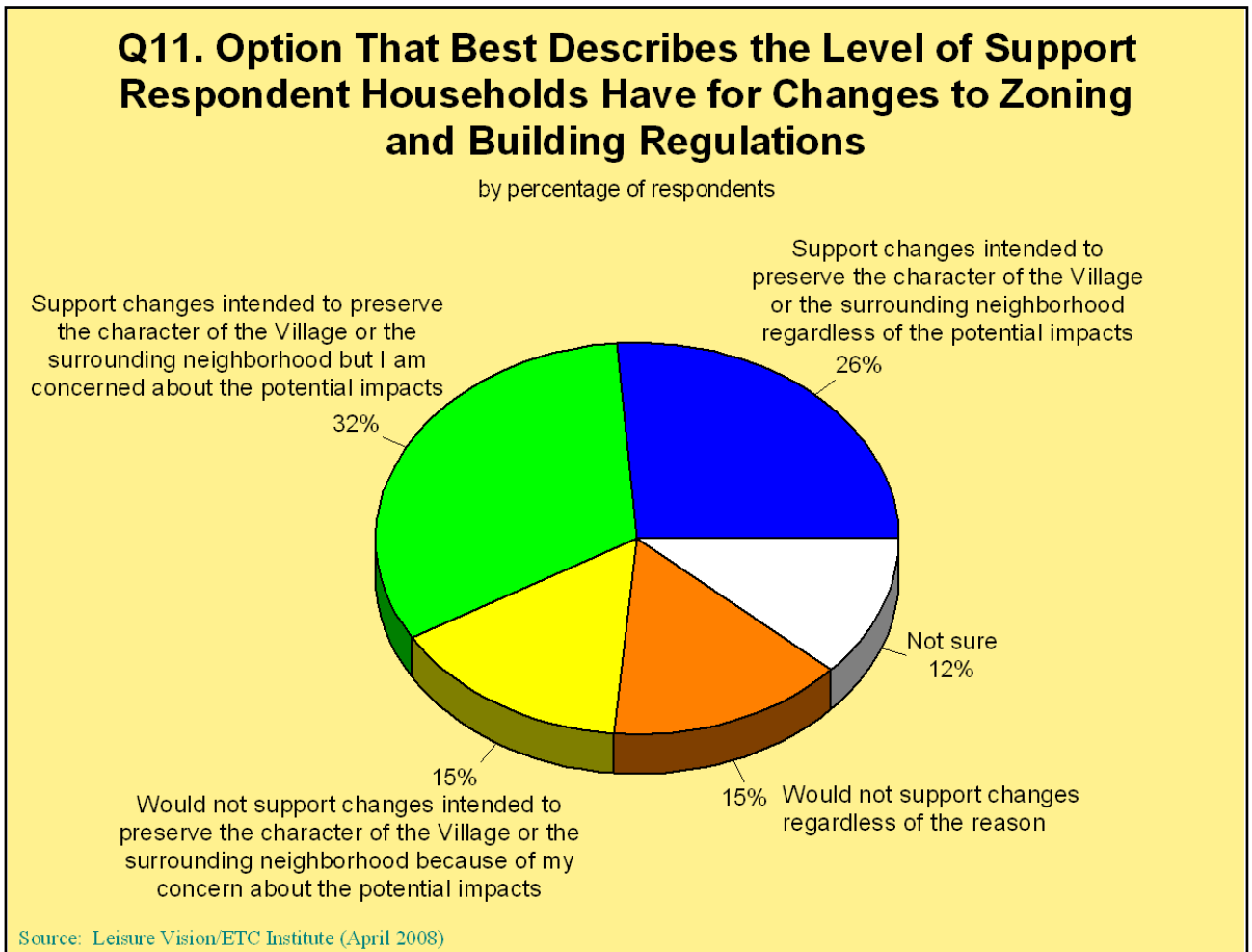
- Fifty-three percent (53%) of respondents live in a neighborhood where a homeowners association or neighborhood association has architectural standards or covenants or an architectural review process.



Level of Support for Various Changes to Zoning and Building Regulations

From a list of four options, respondents were asked to select the option that best describes their level of support for changes to zoning and building regulations. The following summarizes key findings:

- Thirty-two percent (32%) of respondents support changes to the zoning and building regulations intended to preserve the character of the Village or the surrounding neighborhood but are concerned about the potential impact. Twenty-six percent (26%) of respondents support changes intended to preserve the character of the Village or the surrounding neighborhood regardless of the potential impacts.



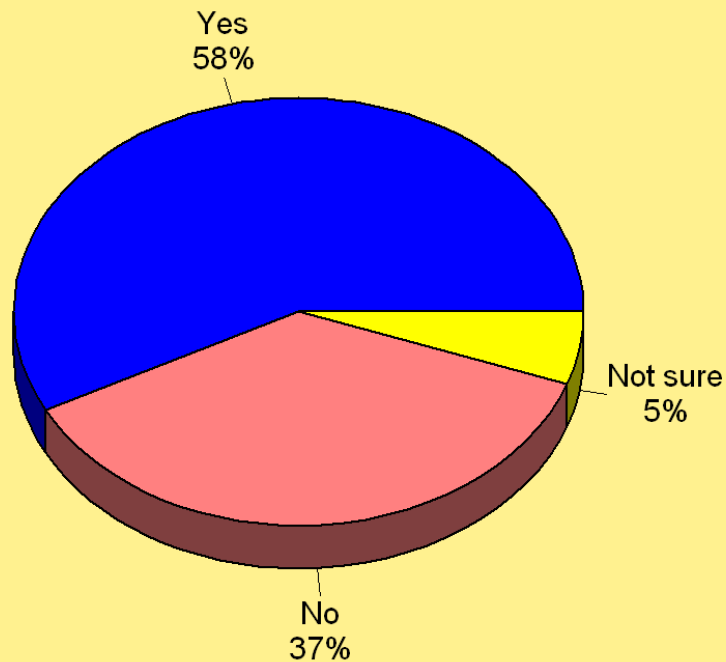
Awareness of the 2007 Citizens City Center Committee Report

by percentage of respondents

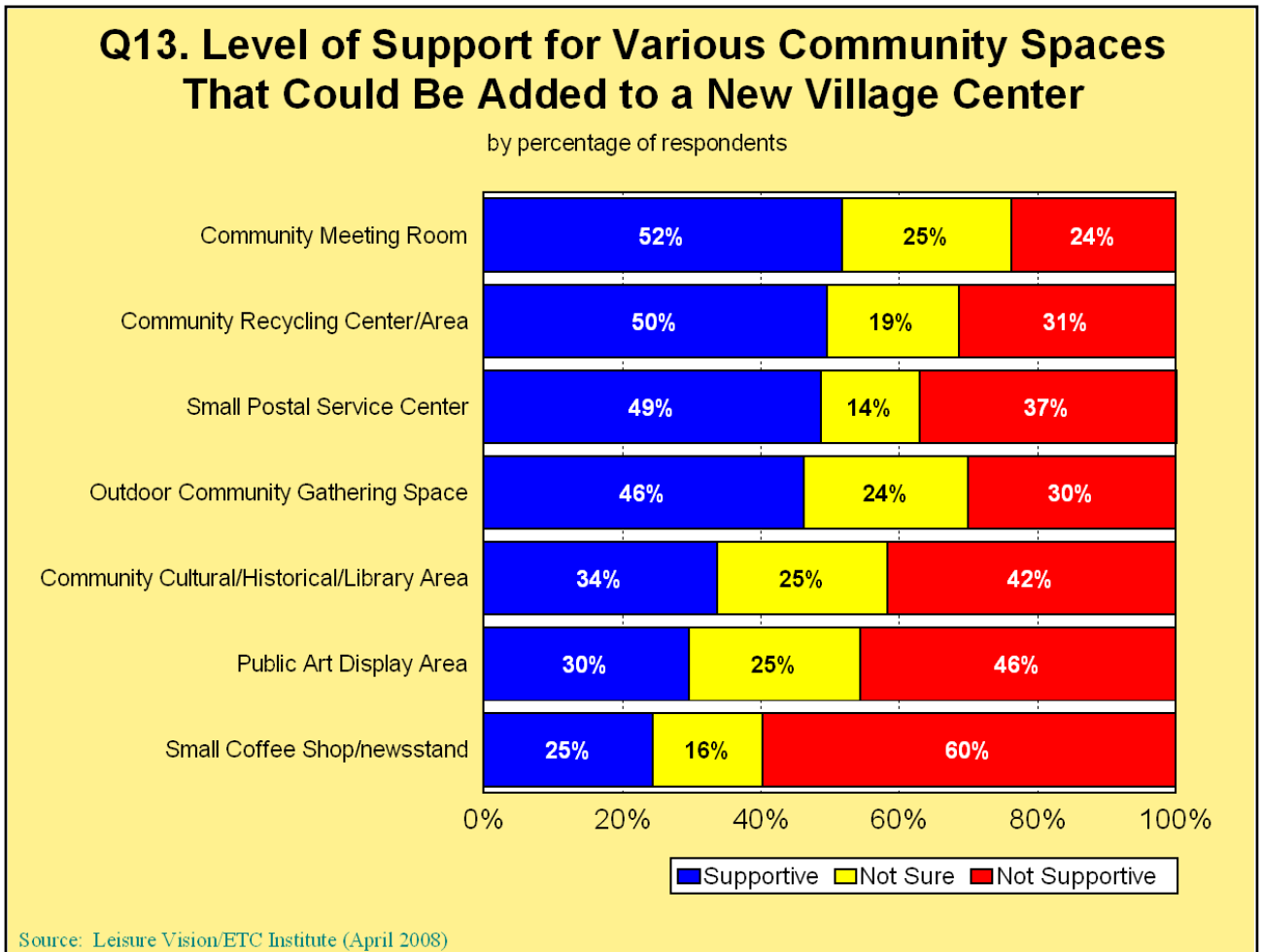

From a list of seven community spaces that could be added to a new Village Center, respondents were asked to rate their level of support for each one. The following summarizes key findings:

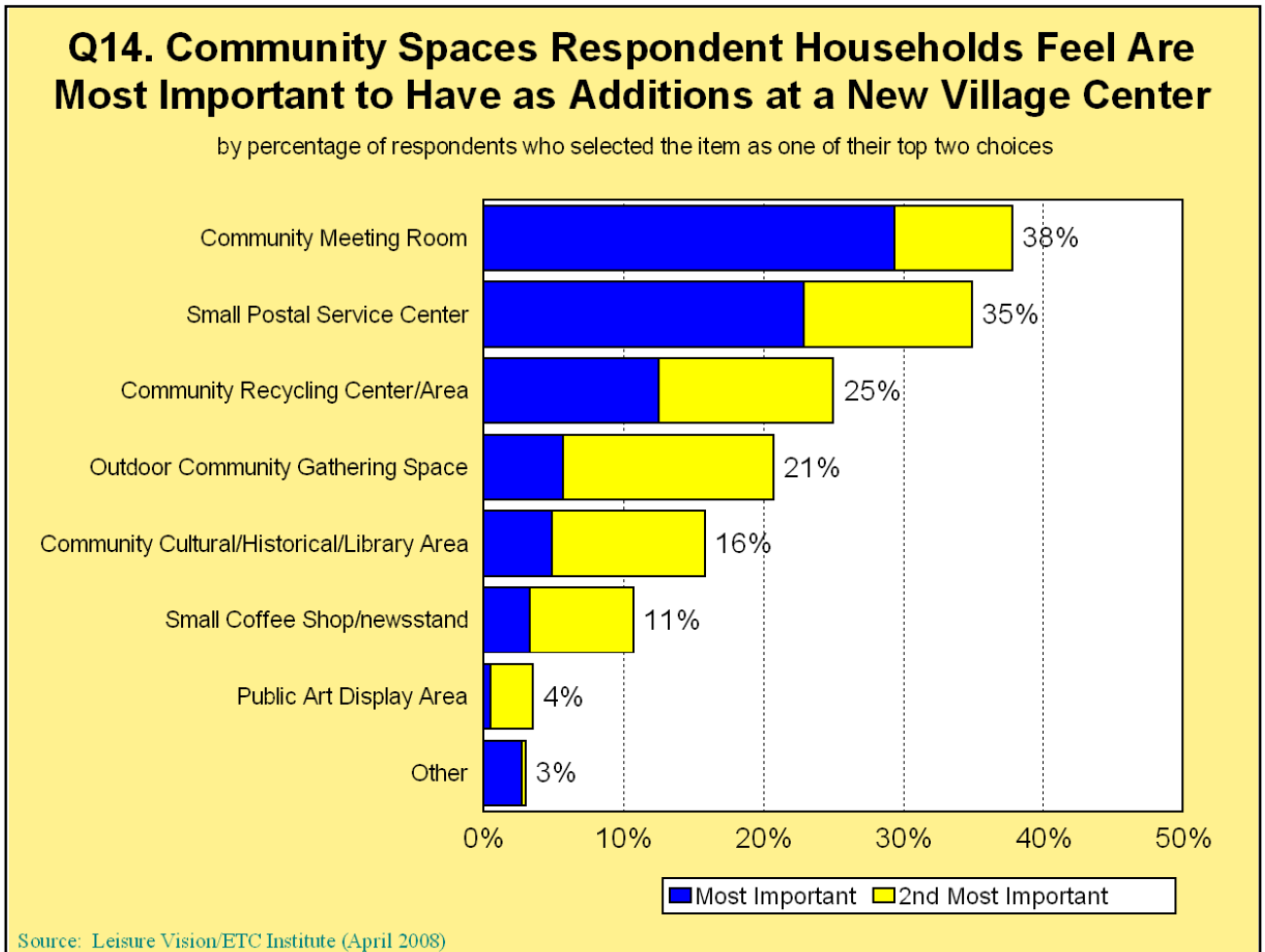
- There are four community spaces that over 45% of respondents are supportive of adding to a new Village Center: community meeting rooms (52%), community recycling center/area (50%), small postal service center (49%) and outdoor community gathering space (46%).

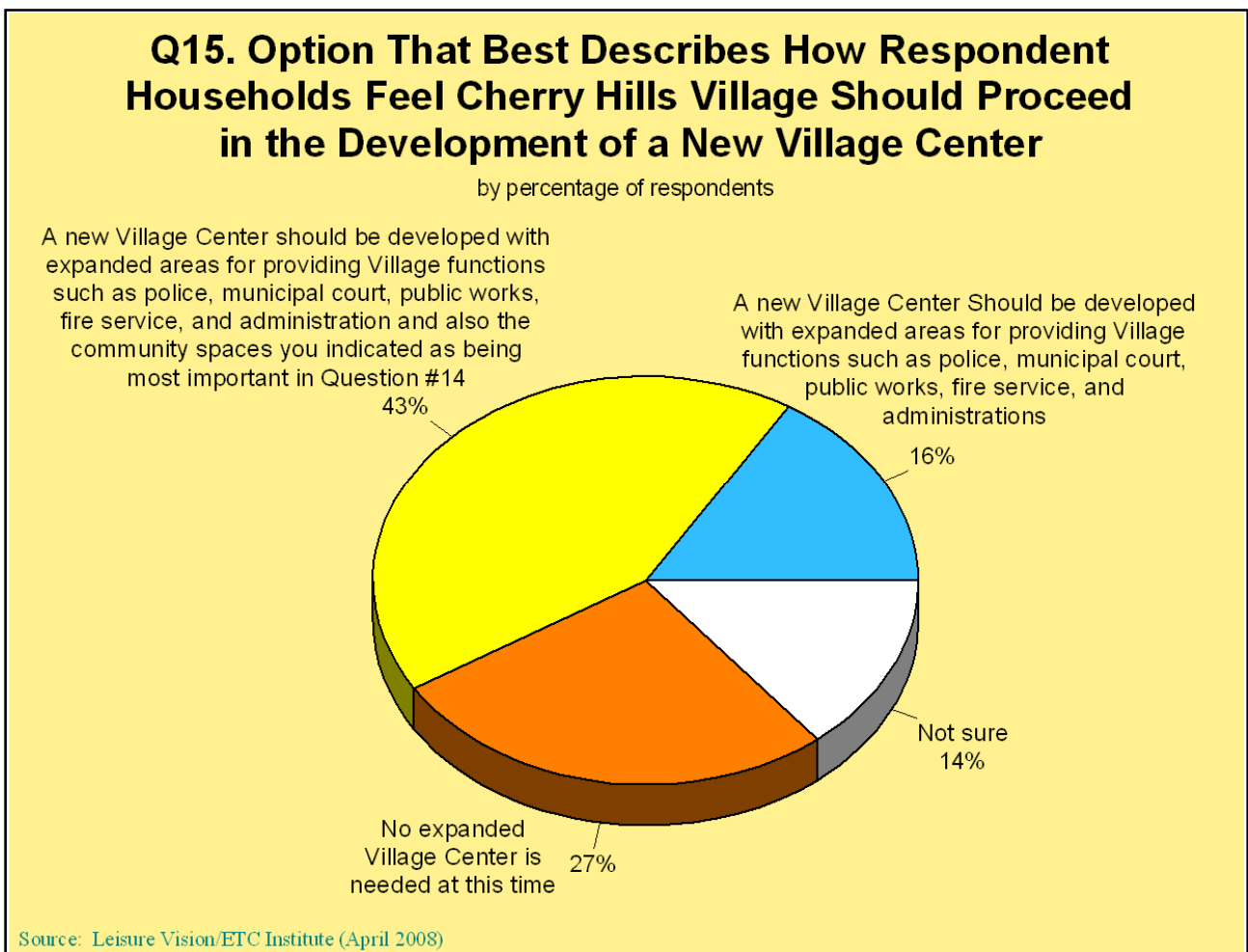

From a list of three options, respondents were asked to select the option that best describes how they feel Cherry Hills Village should proceed in the development of a new Village Center. The following summarizes key findings:

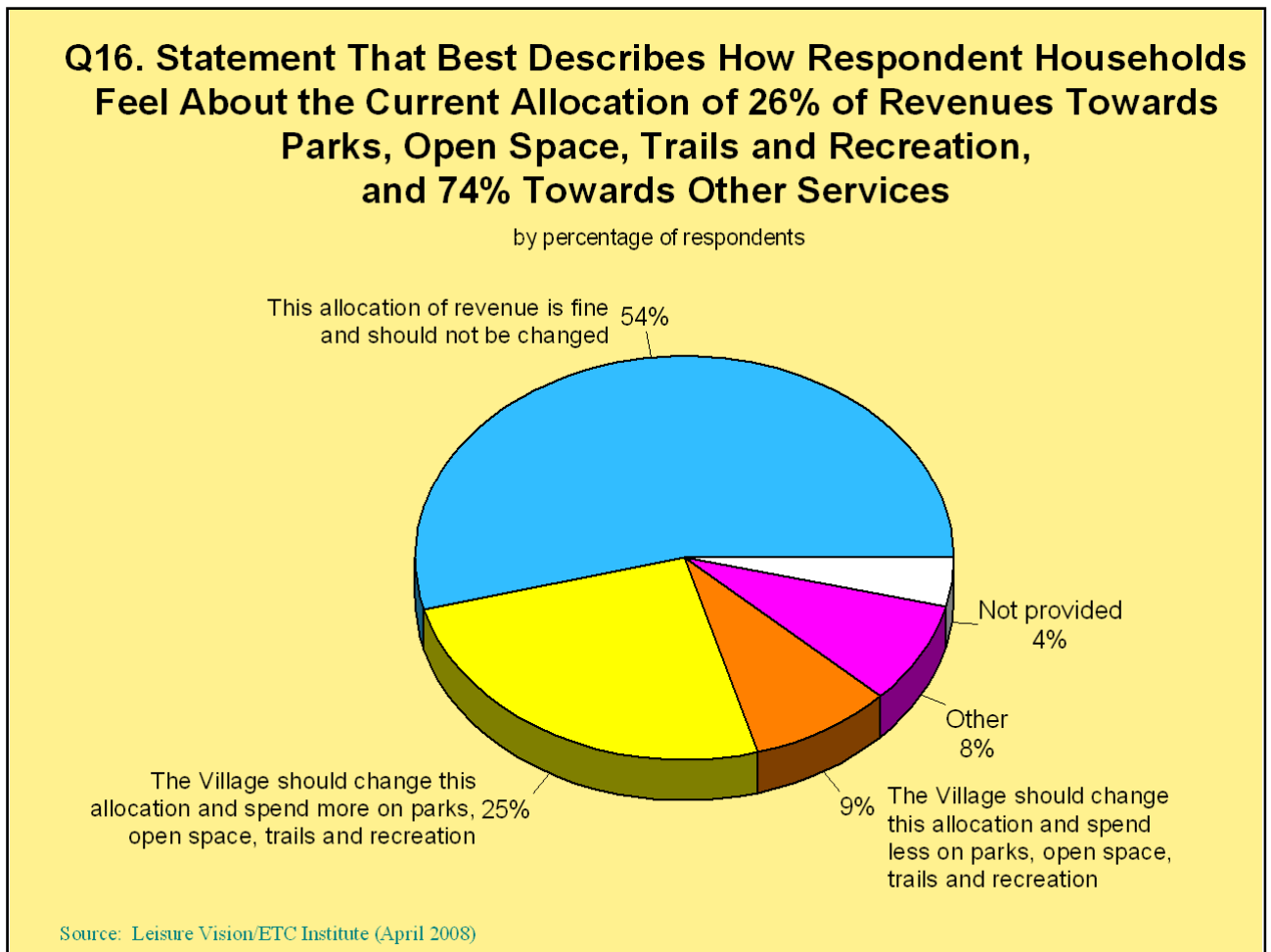
- Forty-three percent (43%) of respondents feel a new Village Center should be developed with an expanded area for various functions, including the community spaces preferred in question #14. Sixteen percent (16%) of respondents feel a new Village Center should be developed with an expanded area for various functions, but not including the community spaces, and 27% of respondents do not feel an expanded Village Center is needed at this time.



Current Allocation of Revenues

From a list of three options, respondents were asked to select the option that best describes how they feel about the current allocation of 26% of Village revenues towards parks, open space, trails and recreation, and 74% toward other services. The following summarizes key findings:

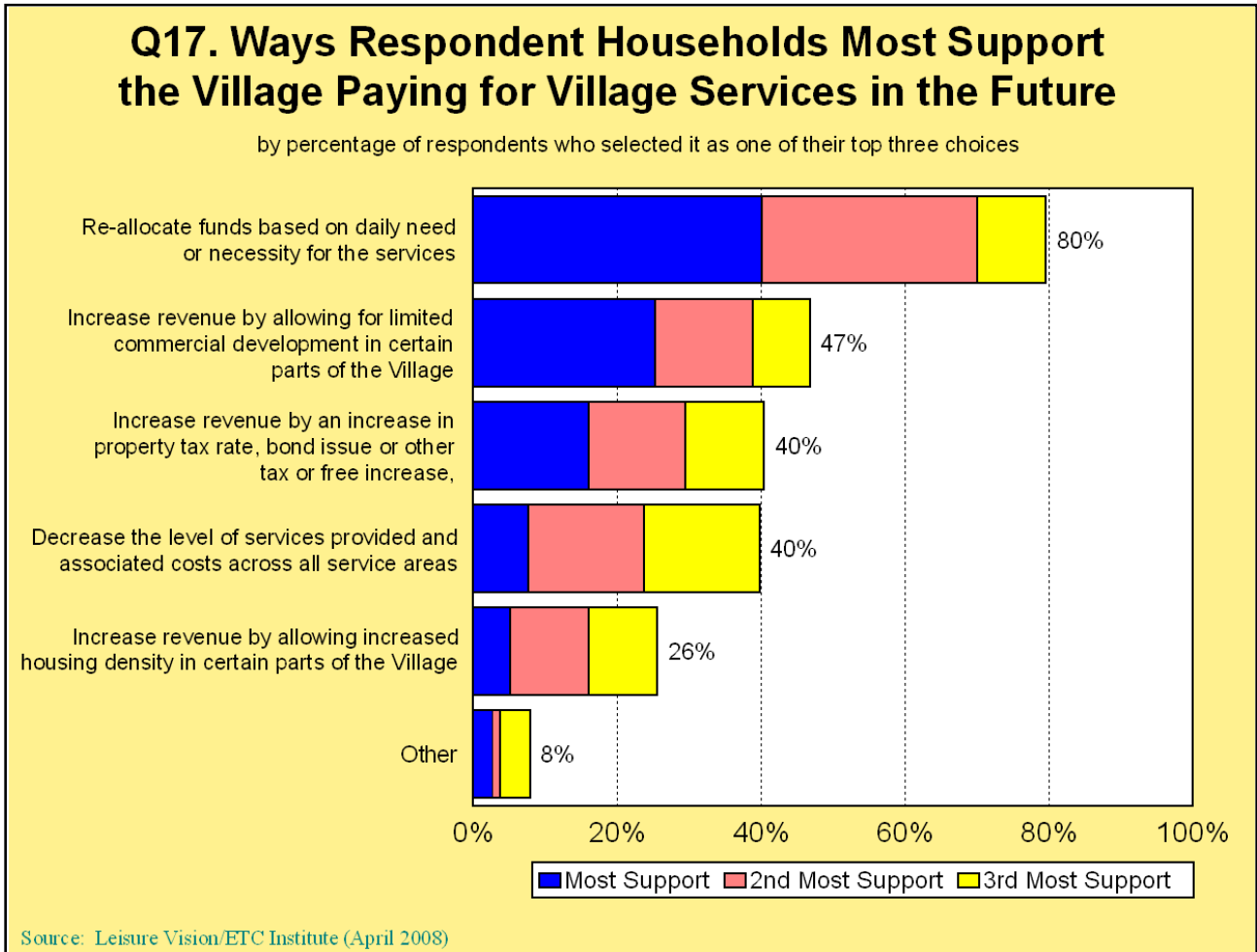
- Fifty-four percent (54%) of respondents feel the current allocation of revenues is fine and should not be changed. Twenty-five percent (25%) of respondents feel the Village should allocate and spend more on parks, open space, trails and recreation, and only 9% feel the Village should allocate and spend less on parks, open space, trails and recreation.

From a list of five options, respondents were asked to select the three ways they most support the Village paying for Village services in the future. The following summarizes key findings:

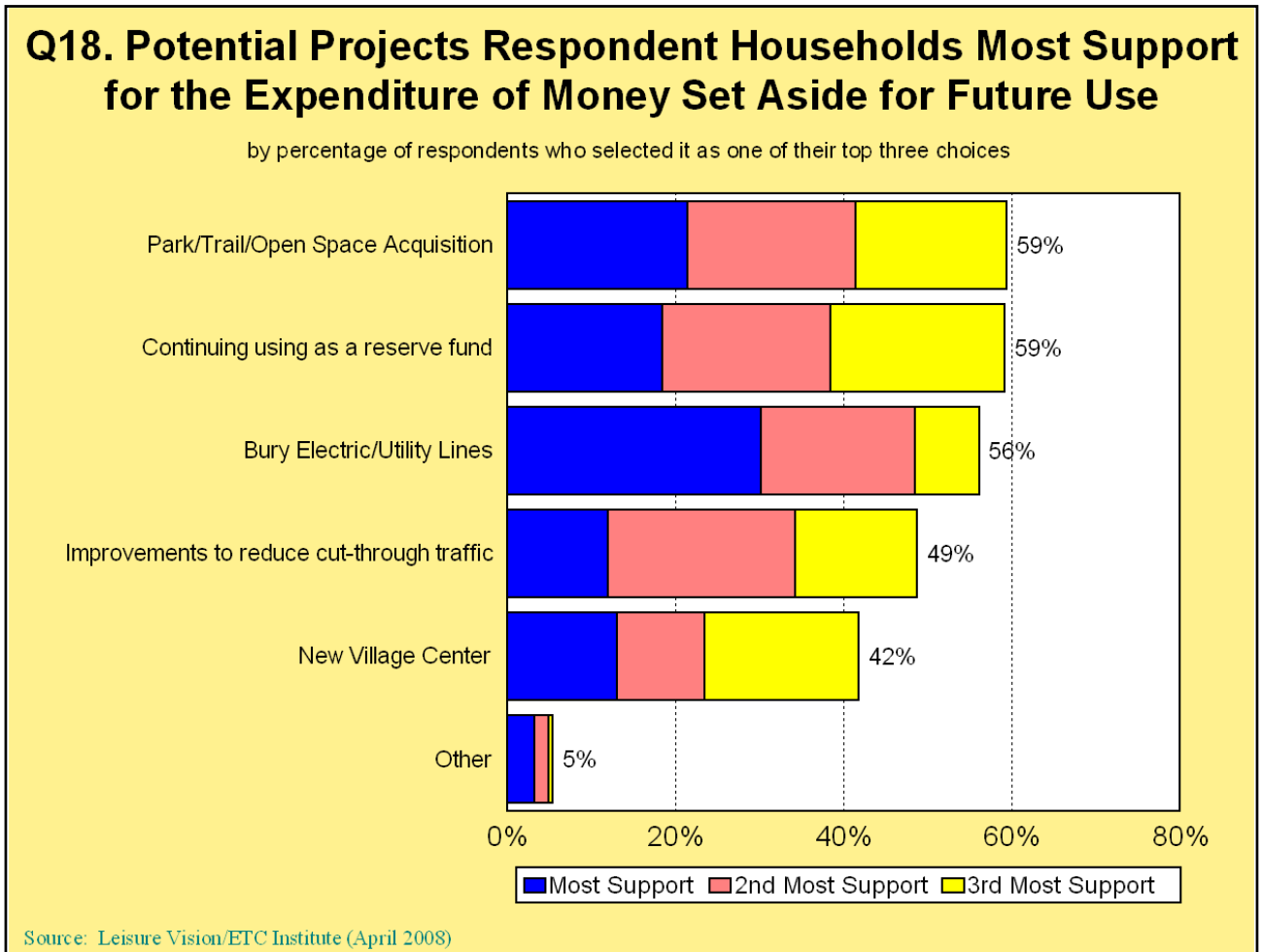
- Based on the sum of their top three choices, 80% of respondents feel the Village should pay for Village services in the future by re-allocating funds based on daily need or necessity for the services.
