## State Likely to Attempt to PRE-EMPT LOCAL LAND USE CONTROL

Following Governor Polis' state of the state address in January of this year, local governments have been anticipating that the state legislature will introduce a series of bills that will attempt to pre-empt the home rule authority of local governments that is written into the state constitution. While no legislation has been introduced at the time this article was written, the stated intent of the anticipated legislation is to increase affordable housing and reduce carbon emissions in the state. In his state of the state address, the Governor is quoted as saying, "...we need more flexible zoning to allow more housing, streamlined regulations that cut through red tape, expedited approval processes for projects like modular housing, sustainable development, and more building in transit-oriented communities."

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Cherry Hills Village anticipates the legislature will propose:

- ❖ A statewide housing needs assessment in each region and the development of housing strategies that would help local governments meet those needs. Local governments would be required to update these plans every 5 years and report housing data to the state annually.
- ❖ The elimination of parking minimums and encouraging more affordable housing near transit centers.
- ❖ Requiring local governments to provide residents with the right of first refusal to purchase or rent new affordable housing units if they are displaced by new development.
- ❖ The reduction of minimum lot sizes and the addition of requirements that duplexes, triplexes, fourplexes, cottage clusters, and townhomes can be built in single-family zones, and up to six units per lot if two are affordable.
- ❖ Requiring local governments to allow accessory dwelling units (ADUs) by right.
- ❖ Incentivizing smart growth through incorporation of land use planning in the transportation planning process.
- ❖ Prohibition of residential growth caps.

While Cherry Hills Village supports the goal of increasing affordable housing across the state, the Village is opposed to any infringement on local land use authority that has been guaranteed to home rule jurisdictions in Colorado for over 100 years. Local government is generally seen as the most responsive to the needs of local residents and is in the best position to make land use decisions for their community. As evidenced, City Council approved the 2022 Master Plan in December of 2022, with the Vision Statement that Cherry Hills Village is; "A safe, serene, low-density residential community. It is the desire of the citizens of Cherry Hills Village to maintain and enhance the established character of the community through the implementation of the City's planning goals and actions, regulations, and decisions." A state mandate that the Village must allow ADUs by right, or that the Village must allow lots that don't meet the City's

minimum standards, or that the Village must allow residences other than single-family homes is in direct opposition to the City's established and desired character.

The Cherry Hills Village City Council is aware of this issue at the state capital and has been working to advocate for the interest of Village residents. Council members are coordinating with their elected counterparts across the state to advocate for local land use control. The Arapahoe County local elected officials, including Cherry Hills Village Council members, have a lunch scheduled with the Arapahoe County state representatives on March 24th to advocate for local land use control. At the direction of City Council, the Village has hired a lobbyist to advocate for the Village's interest at the state capital. Additionally, staff has been coordinating with Arapahoe County, other Arapahoe County jurisdictions, and the Colorado

Municipal League (CML) to strategize and coordinate how best to advocate for the Village's interests.

- Our small community has insufficient water, storm water, sewer, telecommunication, and transportation infrastructure to support the increased density that would be allowed under this proposal.
- Loss of local control means loss of ability for residents to engage in the community development process.

First, our fabulous City Manager, Chris Cramer, told us in January that he was moving to Spain for a year for his family to take advantage of a wonderful opportunity to study abroad. In these crazy post-COVID days of the great resignation and quiet quitting, etc. we know that good employees are hard to find. The Council got creative and developed a plan to let Chris take a one-year leave of absence instead of leaving all together. We decided to hire an interim City Manager to fill-in for Chris while he is away. We formed a search committee, went through a public hiring process, and were extraordinarily lucky to find an exceptionally qualified candidate – our former City Manager, Jim Thorsen! ## Acceptable Items for drop-off:

- Shredding

- Car batteries (provided they are not leaking)
- Consumer electronics (laptops, desktops, monitors, microwaves, cell phones, printers, gaming systems, CD/DVD players, fax machines and scanners)
- Flat screen televisions up to 48"
- Paint products (oil based paint, latex paint)
- Batteries (AA, AAA, C, D and rechargeable)
- Fluorescent light bulbs (compact fluorescent lamps (CFL) and straight fluorescent tubes) and lamp fixtures
- Trash, including bulky items, and furniture



## Items that will NOT be accepted:

- Large appliances (refrigerators, washers, dryers, vacuums, etc.)
- Hazardous materials/chemicals (i.e. liquid mercury, leaking or empty containers, unknown or unlabeled materials and radioactive items)
- CRT (tube or projection) televisions
- Biological waste
- Commercial or business supplies
- Incandescent light bulbs
- Asbestos
- Ammunition and explosives
- Tires
- Construction-related materials
- Medicines and prescriptions
- Smoke detectors and items improperly packaged for transportation

# FLOODPLAIN DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS

## and National Flood Insurance Program

The City has participated in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) Community Rating System (CRS) since 1978, making residents eligible for federally backed flood insurance and flood insurance discounts.

To participate in this program, the City has adopted minimum standards and regulations for construction in the floodplain, conducts regular drainage way maintenance, and provides community outreach on floodplain issues. Cherry Hills Village is then rated on a point system whereby the total number of points equates to an overall rating. The overall ratings range from 1 to 10 with a 1 resulting in the most discount to flood insurance. The City's current rating is a 7, which means Village residents are eligible for a 15% discount for their flood insurance rates. The City continues



to work towards a lower rating and to expand our best management practices in dealing with floodplain related issues.

There are approximately 200 properties in the Village that intersect a floodplain designated on the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) adopted by the City. If a structure is located in a floodplain, flood insurance will be required by most mortgage lenders.

In Cherry Hills Village, most development in the floodplain is prohibited unless a floodplain variance is granted by City Council. If you want to know if your property is in the designated floodplain or for more information on

any new construction in the floodplain, you can contact the Cherry Hills Village Community Development Department at (303) 783-2721, stop by the Village Center at 2450 E. Quincy Avenue, or visit the City's Floodplain page at: <https://www.cherryhillsvillage.com/386/Floodplain-Development>

The Community Development Department maintains records of all current and past adopted floodplain maps and Flood Hazard Area Delineation (FHAD) areas, flood depth data for most currently mapped areas of the City and FEMA issued elevation certificates.

### Helpful Tips...

The following are helpful tips for residents who live in flood prone areas:

- ◆ Know the extent and nature of the flood hazard in your area.
- ◆ Plan escape routes to high ground.
- ◆ Buy flood insurance for your property.
- ◆ During times of heavy rainfall watch the level of water in the drainage way and stay tuned to radio or television for possible flood warnings.
- ◆ Evacuate the flood hazard area in times of an impending flood.




# VEGETABLE VARIETIES FOR CONTAINER PLANTING

How rewarding it is to grow vegetables at home! The chart (to the right) can help gardeners purchase the proper plant varieties for the best container size. Varieties can be found at local garden centers or online seed companies. Whether using plants or growing from seed, the varieties are ideal for containers.

When searching for other container-suitable cultivars, look for words like “bush, patio, dwarf, mini or compact” in the plant or seed description. Follow the instructions for planting and care.

Finally, choose soil specifically formulated for containers, and when growing from seed, choose a soil designed for seed starting. Both these mixtures are available at local garden centers and online.

## Swarm HOTLINE

Bees swarm in the spring. In Colorado, bees swarm from approximately April 1st until the end of the summer with May and June being the busiest months. A swarm occurs when a hive, wild or managed, becomes overcrowded and the old queen and approximately half of the original hive leaves to find a new home. Swarms are generally quite docile but they can be disconcerting due to the sheer numbers of bees within the swarm. It is still a good idea to keep your distance so as to not make the bees feel threatened.

Swarms will eventually leave on their own, once the scout bees have returned to inform the group that they have found a suitable new home. Where it may have taken an hour or more for the swarm to collect, they can be gone in less than a minute once they get word it is time to go. However, beekeepers prefer to catch the bees as a swarm in case their new home—is yours!

If you are lucky enough to witness one of nature's most fascinating migrations, a swarm, **DO NOT ATTEMPT TO KILL THEM!** Do not spray them with insecticide or water! These bees are "survivor bees" and are crucial to our environmental health. Call the NEW toll-free bee swarm hotline (**1-844-SPY-BEES**).
